Kelly is a graduate of Waller High School, but this was an accomplishment that did not come easy. "I did not see myself graduating high school. I would easily give up because of my learning disability. I never felt like I was good enough," says Kelly. Sports also played a vital role in her life. "Playing soccer helped with my social skills and improved my grades."

Kelly credits her Teaching Parents and several tutors for her academic success. The Education Lab at BGC is equipped to help students like Kelly reach their academic goals. Tutoring and college preparation begin early at BGC. We want our students to envision

graduation as well as a career path that will lead to college or technical training. Kelly desires to pursue a degree and career in Hotel and Restaurant Management.

Boys and Girls Country is blessed to have a dedicated staff and a host of generous volunteers. Kristi Pierce serves as the Program Manager for the Education Department at BGC. She has a long standing relationship
