

Do you have a child between 10 and 13 years old?

If so, you and your child may be eligible to participate in a new research study.

ABOUT THIS STUDY

We think that how the brain responds to actions from others could affect how a child's personality develops. In this study we will look at how certain brain activities related to questions like do you feel like you belong (social acceptance) and how do you see and think about yourself (self-perception) are connected to personality functioning.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- Children aged 10-13 years old, with or without a current or history of a mental health disorder or mental health treatment.
- Youths who speak English fluently
- Parent of the child is willing and able to complete ratings of child and parent relationship.

WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS DO?

- Youth participants will complete tasks while their brain activity is recorded.
- Youth participants and their parent/legal guardian will complete questionnaires regarding how they feel, how they interact, etc.
- Youth participants will interact with an individual who is the same age.
- Help us understand the connection between brain activity, personality, and overall well-being.
