

Understanding the Muslim Community

Hershey All Things Diversity's next virtual educational session with focus on "Understanding the Muslim Community". The session will be held on Wednesday, March 1 from 7:00 to 8:30 PM. Four guest panelists will share insights into the key tenets of Muslim faith, provide some historical perspectives on the American Muslim story and discuss the current dynamics shaping American Muslim communities. Speakers include Ahmet Selim Tekelioglu, the Executive Director of Council-on American Islamic Relations Philadelphia Chapter (CAIR-Philadelphia), Elhaam Jawadi, a current medical student at Penn State College of Medicine, Elisa Thabateh, a Palestinian American graduating senior from Penn State Harrisburg majoring in Biobehavioral Health, and Shazia Hafiz, originally from Pakistan, where she received a degree in Medicine and Surgery, currently an advocate on children's issues and a part time teacher for Derry Township School District.
