**Middle School Schedule 2017-2018**

The Administration in conjunction with the Scheduling Committee has restructured the Wamogo Middle School schedule for the year 2017-18. Our goal is to offer a middle school schedule that positions students for academic success while providing the supports and structures that are responsive to the needs of young adolescents. **Seventh and Eighth Grade Student Assessments**

Standardized testing for all middle school students will begin in April. Due to the recent snow days in March, the testing dates have been adjusted.

Wamogo aims to ensure that your child - and all Region 6 students - receive an education that prepares them to thrive in a global economy and civic life. The Connecticut Core Standards set learning expectations for what students should learn and be able to do at each grade level so that by the time they graduate from high school, they are ready to succeed in college and the workplace.

Statewide assessments are like academic checkups. They provide a snapshot of student achievement to teachers and parents providing insight as where students are in their learning compared to where they need to be. The results can reveal subject areas and specific skills where a student is excelling, as well as provide information as to how to help each child improve. Wamogo's seventh and eighth grade students will take the Smarter Balance Assessments in English language arts and math. The total testing time for most students is approximately 4 hours. Testing sessions will be spread out over the course of several days, allowing teachers to plan for developmentally appropriate testing time frames for students.

The testing window begins the week of May 1 and concludes the week of May 8. During the week of May 1, the Math will be administered over a three-day period in 70 minute sessions each day. English Language Arts will be administered the week of May 8 over a two-day period in a 70 minute session each day.
