**EESMARTS and Eli Whitney Museum Field Trip**

On Tuesday, June 6 the seventh grade class will be traveling to EESMARTS in North Haven, CT and the Eli Whitney Museum in Hamden, CT. **EESmarts** (*eemarts™*) is a clean, renewable energy learning initiative funded by the Connecticut Energy Efficiency Fund. The vision of eesmarts is to facilitate students' understanding of the science, math, and technology related to clean, renewable energy and electricity in order to create an energy-efficient ethic among all school-age students in Connecticut.

The **Eli Whitney Museum** and Workshop is an experimental learning workshop for students. During our visit, students will participate in the PinBall Project. This is a popular project that teaches game design (beginnings, middles and ends), logic (rewards for difficulty), marble movement (caroms, momentum) and creative design (good games must still attract players.) The project is a rare exploration of the work of play.

**Summer Camp at Wamogo**

Wamogo Regional High School is pleased to announce that for the upcoming summer of 2017, we are running our very own summer program: Summerfest. Additional information can be located by clicking [here](#).

This is a 6 week long camp-style program that is 4 days a week (Monday through Thursday) from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., and runs from June 26 to August 3. Sessions are split into 2 week increments and you may sign

your child up for multiple sessions if you so choose. Summerfest is open to all Region 6 students of all ability levels in grades 2 through 8. The cost is \$75 per week per child with transportation available from central locations for participants. July 5 to 7 is a shortened week and costs \$50.

Summerfest features tons of fun, daily activities led by a team of peer leaders, which include: outdoor sports, classic camp games, arts and crafts, music and drama, water carnivals, cooking, gardening, STEM, dance, team building games, and much more.

#### **Middle School Schedule 2017-2018**

The administration in conjunction with the scheduling committee has restructured the Wamogo middle school schedule for the year 2017-18. Our goal is to offer a middle school schedule that positions students for academic success while providing the supports and structures that are responsive to the needs of young adolescents. #### **7th and 8th Grade Student Assessments**

Wamogo's seventh and eighth grade students will take the **Smarter Balance** Assessments in English language arts and math. The total testing time for most students is approximately 4 hours. Testing sessions will be spread out over the course of several days, allowing teachers to plan for developmentally appropriate testing time frames for students.

The testing window begins the week of May 1 and concludes the week of May 8. During the week of May 1, the Math will be administered over a three-day period in 70 minute sessions each day. English Language Arts will be administered the week of May 8 over a two-day period in a 70 minute session each day.
