

Severe Storms Possible Through Tuesday Night

Greatest Threat This Afternoon – Tonight

Key Messages

• This afternoon – Tonight: Primary threats are winds up to 80 mph, hail up to tennis ball size, a few tornadoes, and locally heavy rainfall and potential flooding concerns.



What Has Changed

A Moderate Risk for severe storms was added across central and south-central Kansas.

This will be the final update.



Forecast Confidence

Location

Low Medium High

Confidence is high that much of the area will see rain, though some uncertainty remains regarding exactly where the strongest storms will develop. At this point, the most likely area of severe storm development appears to be across central and south-central Kansas.

Timing

Low Medium High

Confidence is high in storms developing sometime after 3 PM and lasting through early Wednesday morning.

Magnitude

Low Medium High

Confidence to this point is high that the strongest storms (especially during the afternoon and early evening) will be capable of up to tennis ball sized hail, 80+ mph wind gusts, and a few tornadoes. Additionally, confidence is medium-high in the potential for heavy rainfall causing flooding concerns heading into the overnight hours.
