

Winter Storm for Monday-Tuesday

Key Messages

- Moderate and heavy snow with blowing and drifting late Monday into Tuesday.
- Travel could be very difficult to impossible over central Kansas
- <u>Whiteout</u> conditions are likely to occur Monday night primarily over central Kansas
- Cold on Tuesday & much colder Friday into next weekend

Timing

- Along and north of I-70: Monday evening to Monday night
- South of I-70: Monday night into Tuesday morning

What Has Changed NEW

- Delayed transition to snow
- Increased wind speeds Monday night-Tuesday







Snow Probabilities



Location

High Medium Low

While the most severe impacts will likely be along and north of I-70, how far south impacts extend is still uncertain.

Timing

High Low Medium

Confidence is high that areas generally north of I-70 will start to see impacts on Monday with locations south of I-70 seeing most impacts on Monday night into Tuesday morning. There will be a lull in precipitation over southern Kansas on Monday with another round coming through Monday night into early Tuesday.

Magnitude

High Low **Medium**


Confidence is high for snow with significant blowing and drifting of snow. Dangerous whiteout visibility conditions will occur at times over portions of central Kansas.






