


Probability of Snow Totals for Tuesday Night - Wednesday

Expected Winter Weather Impacts

Major Impacts

- Expect **considerable** disruptions to daily life.
- **Dangerous** driving conditions - Avoid travel if possible
- **Widespread** closures and disruptions may occur


Moderate Impacts

- Expect disruptions to daily life
- **Hazardous** driving conditions - Use extra caution while driving
- Some closures and disruptions may occur

Minor Impacts

- Expect a few inconveniences to daily life
- Winter driving conditions - Use caution while driving

Forecast Confidence Tue Night-Wed

February 10, 2025
3:40 AM

Location

Low **Medium** High

While confidence is high that much of the area will see snow, the highest snow accumulation is expected across central Kansas between I-70 and Highway 56.

Timing

Low Medium **High**

Confidence remains **HIGH** that snow will develop later Tuesday night and continue into Wednesday.

Magnitude

Low **Medium** High

Confidence is increasing that heavy snow will develop late Tuesday night into early Wednesday morning. Some areas between Highway 56 and I-70 in central Kansas may see around 8 inches of snow with locally higher amounts possible through Wednesday.
