- There is some uncertainty with regards to the overall severity and coverage of the storms due to possible cloud coverage lingering longer both days.

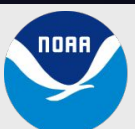

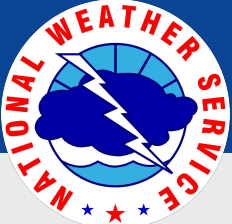

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Confidence in Severity & Coverage

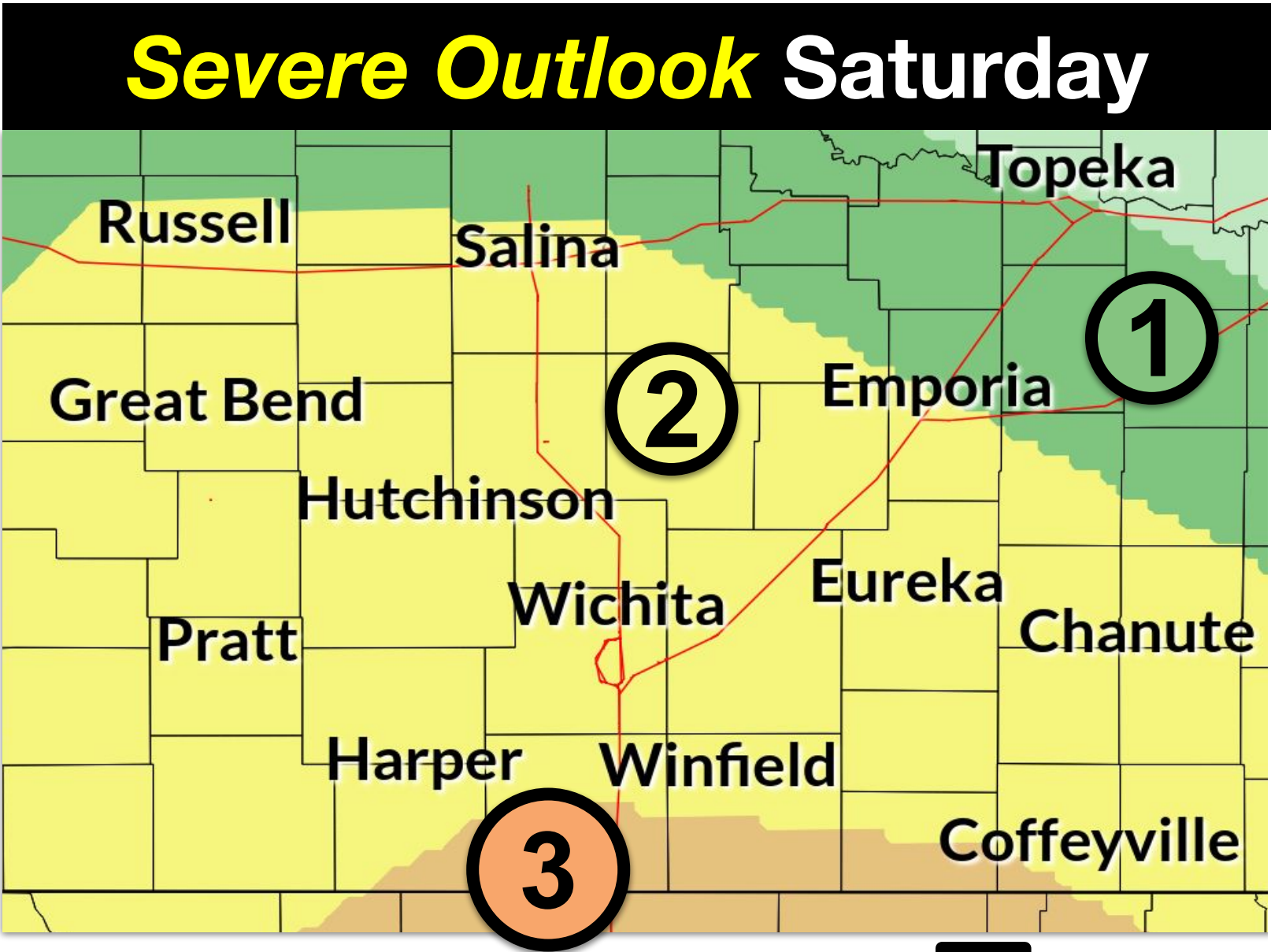


There is low to medium confidence for a few strong to severe storms to develop. Large hail and damaging winds would be the primary risk Saturday afternoon and evening.

Confidence in Location

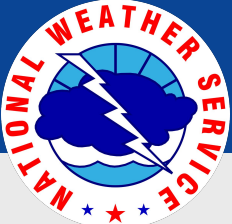


Confidence is medium that the stronger storms will affect mainly south central and southeast Kansas.

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Confidence in Severity & Coverage

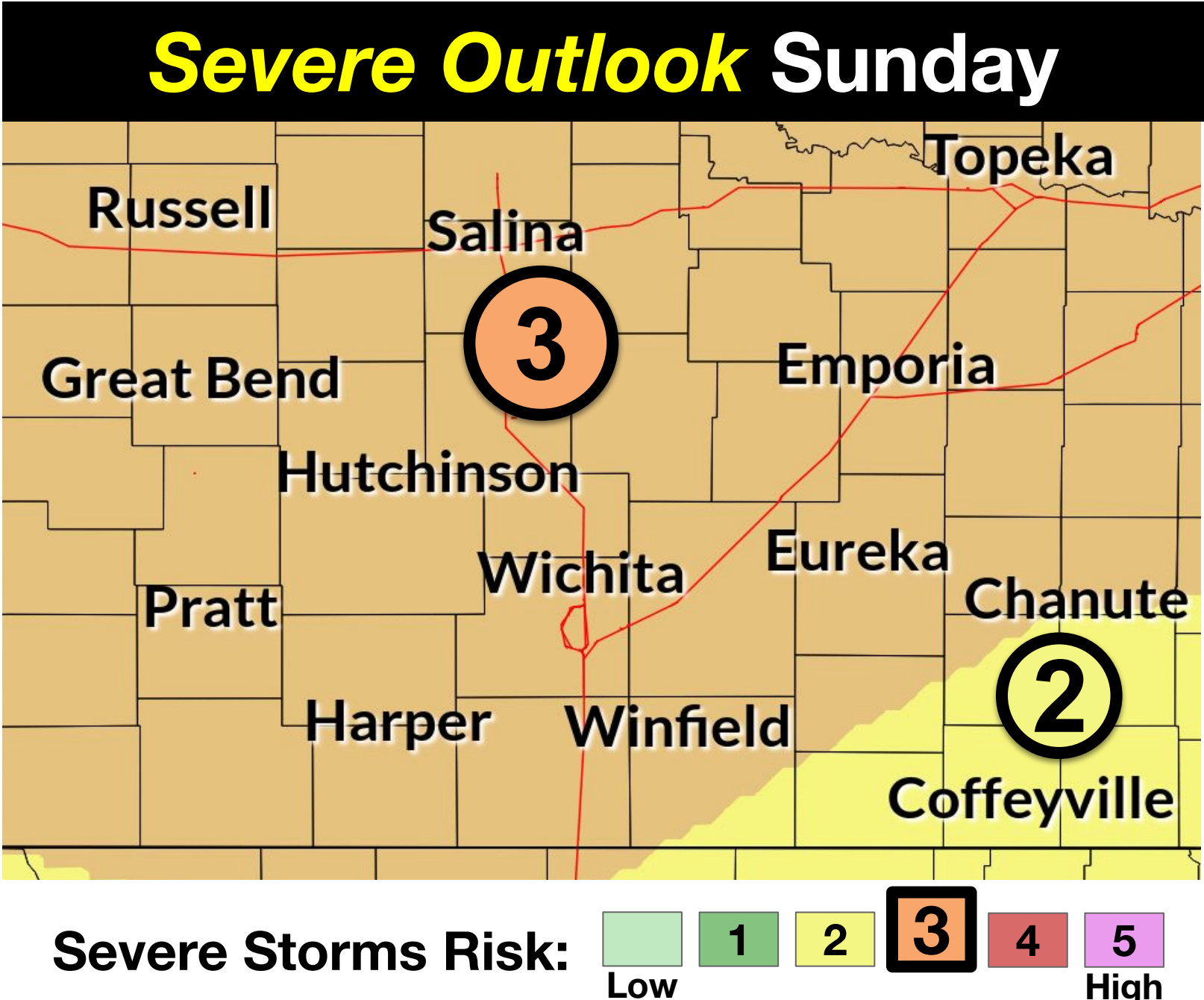


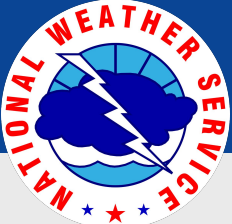
There is potential for a higher-impact severe weather event to occur on Sunday. The forecast is *HIGHLY* dependent on how much the atmosphere can destabilize during the afternoon and exact location of the warm front.

Confidence in Location



If storms develop Sunday afternoon, there is medium confidence that the more intense storms would affect mainly south-central and southeast Kansas.





Severe Weather Safety Information

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Know Where to Go

When Sheltering from a Tornado



If you have no basement, move to an interior room with no windows.

Top floor rooms DO NOT protect you.

Exterior rooms and rooms with windows DO NOT protect you.

NO PLACE OUTSIDE is safe from a tornado.

Quickly move to your basement and bring your emergency supply kit.
