- **Blizzard** conditions possible

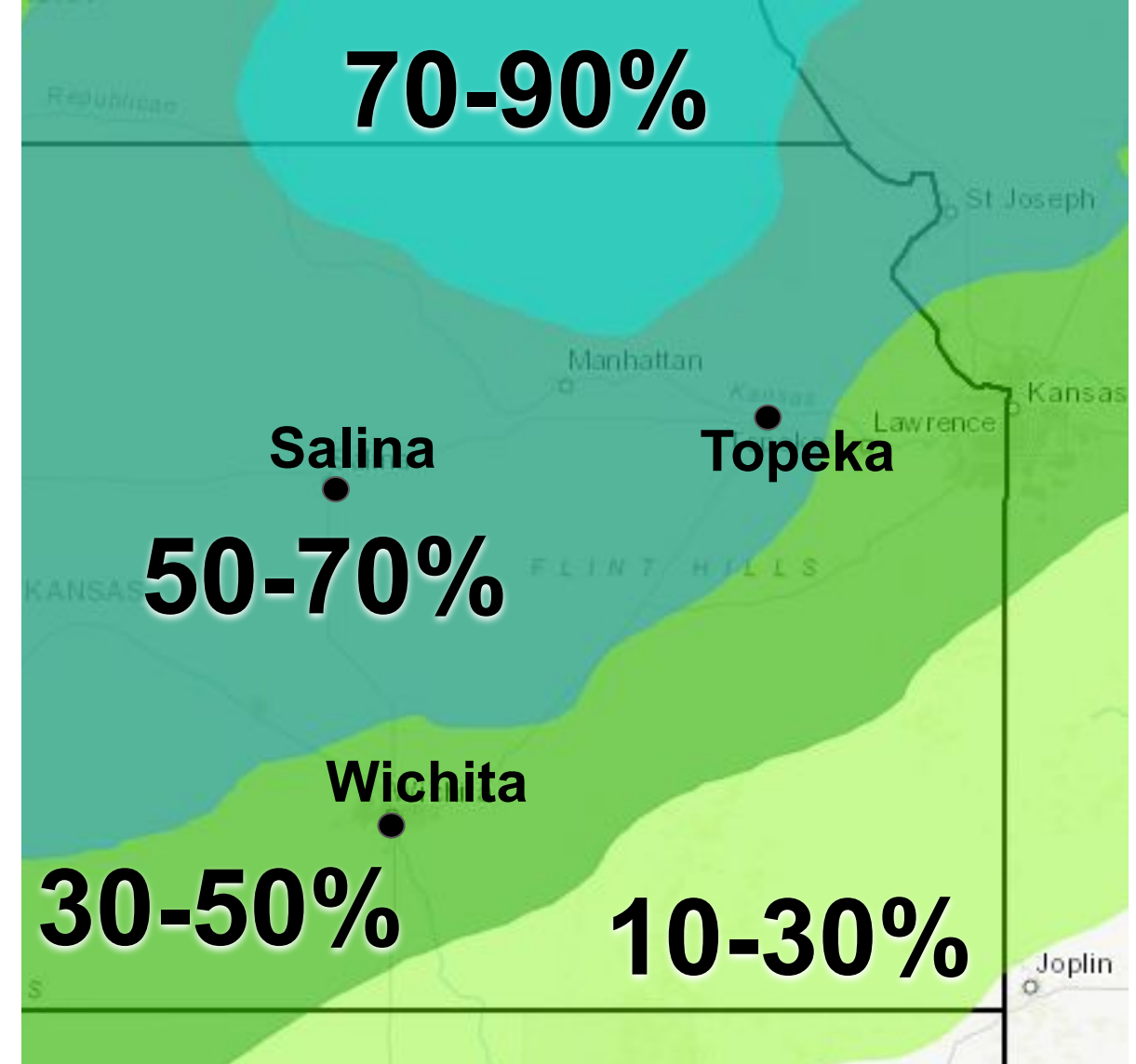
What Has Changed

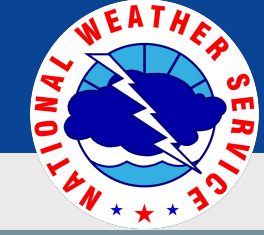

While confidence is high that much of the area will see snow and blowing snow, the exact path of the storm system remains uncertain and will continue to be refined as we move through the weekend.

Timing

Confidence remains high that the storm will impact the region in the Monday-Tuesday timeframe, but the timing of the changeover from rain to snow remains uncertain.

Magnitude

Confidence continues to increase with the potential for accumulating snow and blowing snow as well as a period where *blizzard conditions* could materialize over portions of central Kansas.
