Key Messages

- Light to moderate today with heaviest during morning hours during morning commute.
- Another storm will arrive on Monday and Tuesday bringing the potential for a longer duration of **moderate and heavy snow** with **blowing and drifting snow**.

* Light snow to moderate snow expected this morning into afternoon.

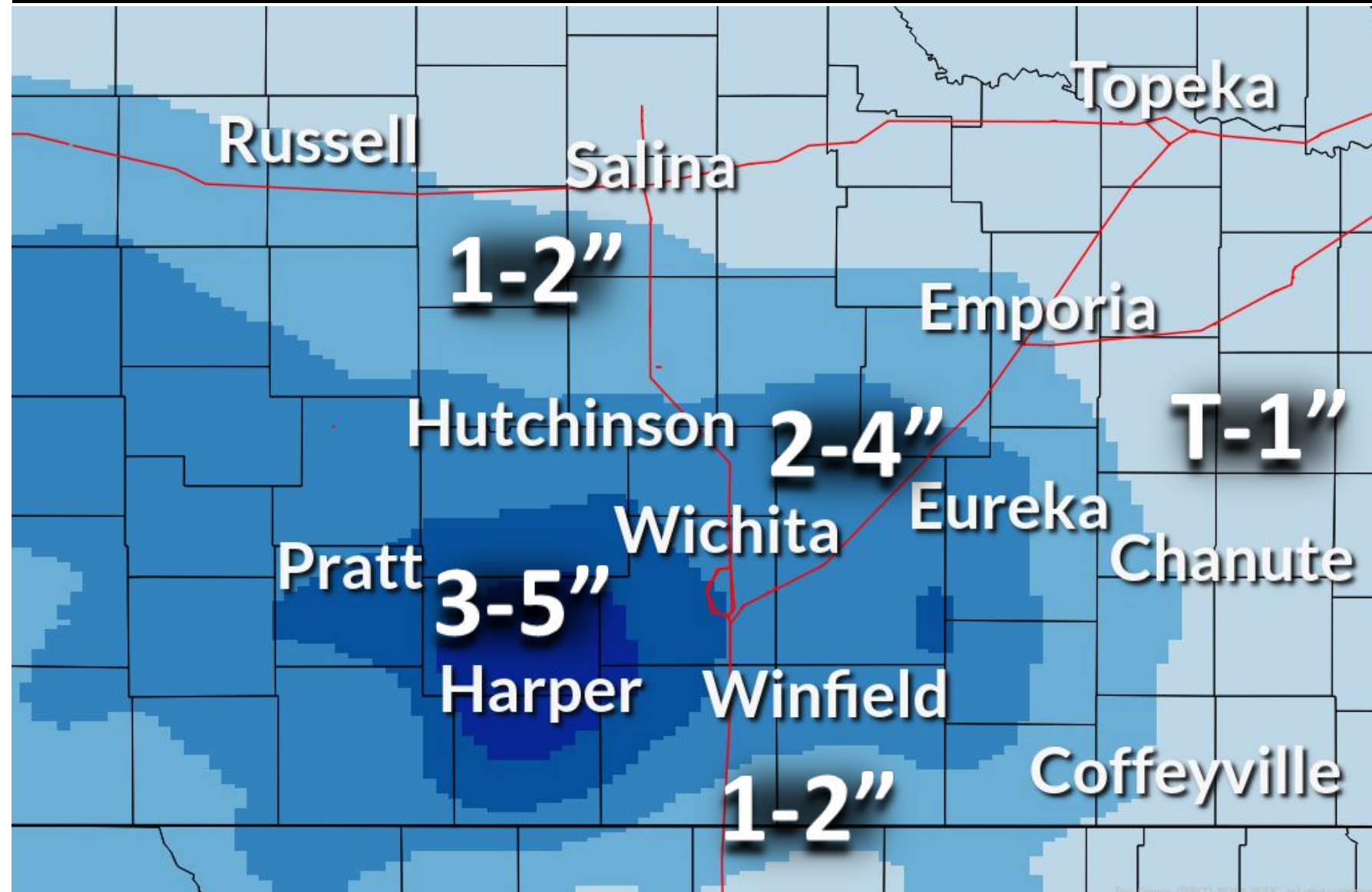
➤ When

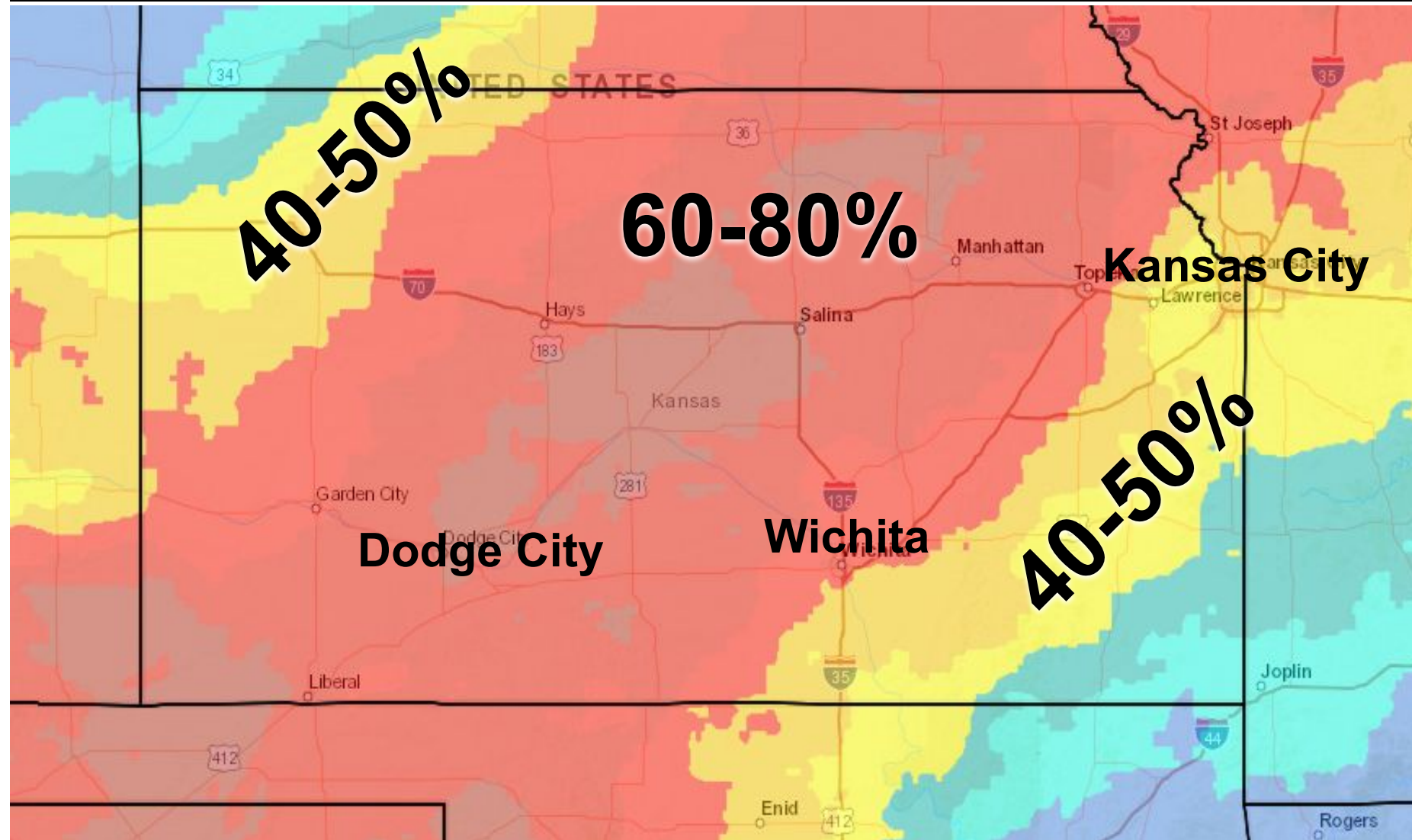

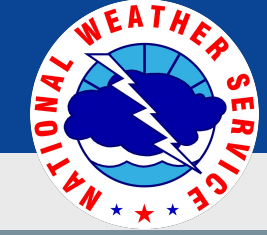
