WHAT

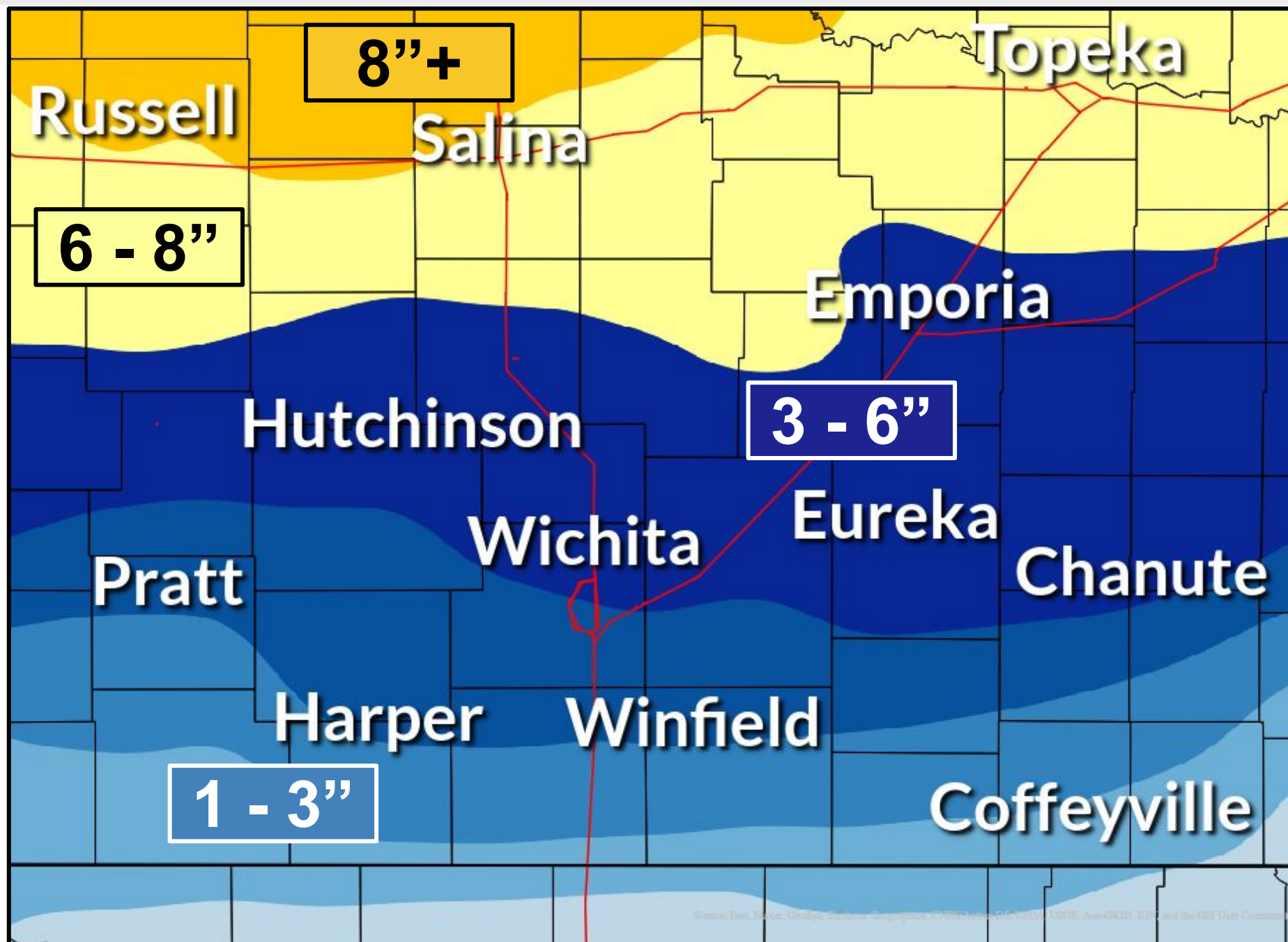
- Widespread snow. Heaviest snow likely across central Kansas.

WHEN

- 9pm Tuesday through 6pm Wednesday.

IMPACTS

- Significant impacts to travel are becoming increasingly likely, especially along I-70.





Expected Winter Weather Impacts

February 11, 2025

Major Impacts

- Expect **considerable** disruptions to daily life.
- **Dangerous** driving conditions - Avoid travel if possible
- **Widespread** closures and disruptions may occur

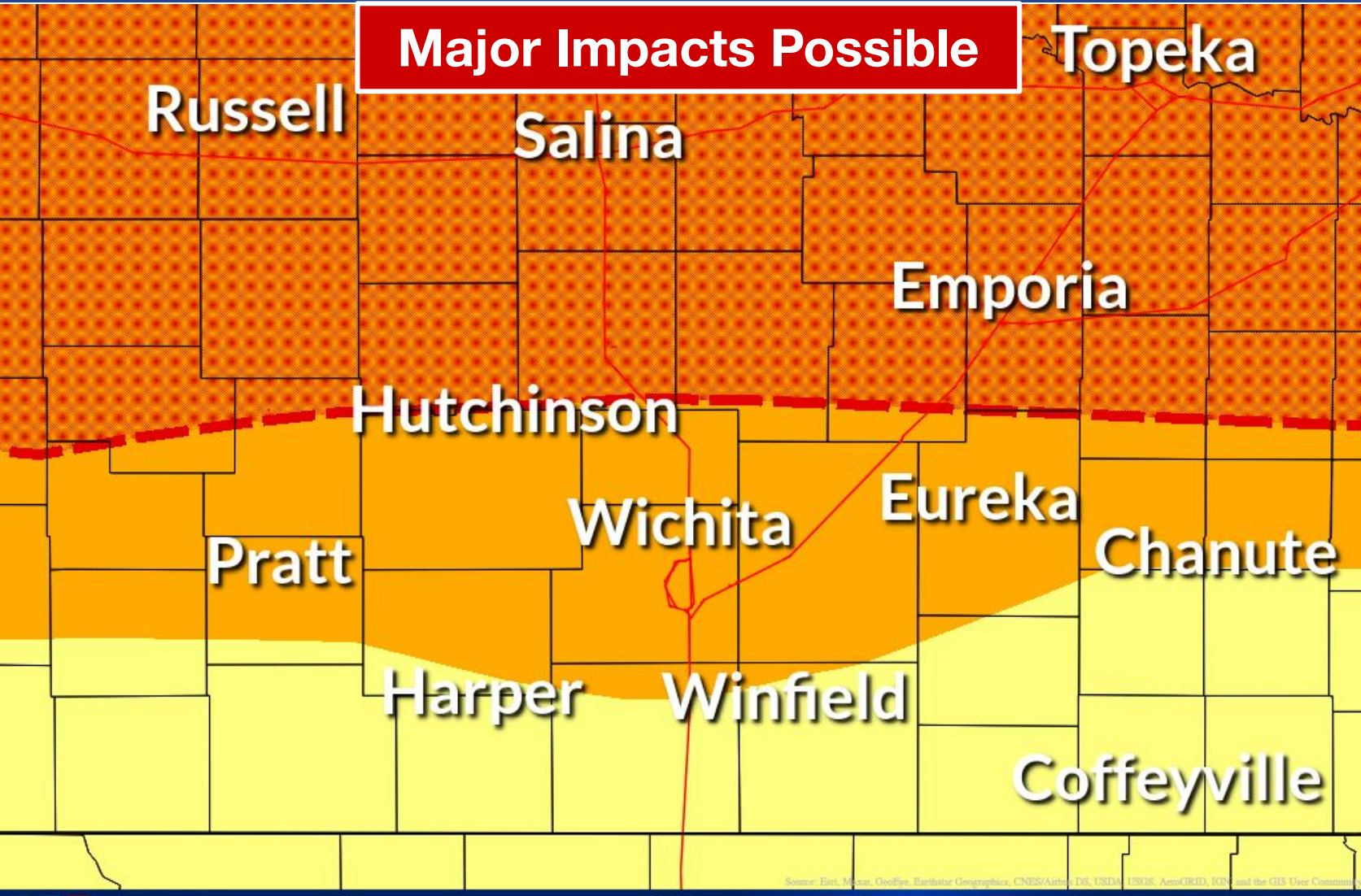
Moderate Impacts

- Expect disruptions to daily life
- **Hazardous** driving conditions - Use extra caution while driving
- Some closures and disruptions may occur

Minor Impacts

- Expect a few inconveniences to daily life
- Winter driving conditions - Use caution while driving

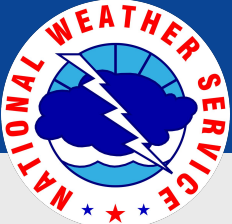

Forecast Confidence **Tonight-Wed**

February 11, 2025
3:14 AM

Location



Confidence is high for the area of highest snow accumulations to be along the I-70 corridor, where 6-8+ inches are forecast. Elsewhere, much of the area will see at least 1 to 4 inches of snow, with locally higher amounts possible along and north of US-50.

Timing



Confidence remains HIGH that snow will develop later this evening and continue into Wednesday. Snow chances are expected to end from west to east during the late morning and afternoon hours on Wednesday.

Magnitude



Confidence is HIGH for the higher snow totals and major impacts to affect central Kansas. Confidence is medium-high in lesser totals and moderate to light impacts for locations along and south of US-50.

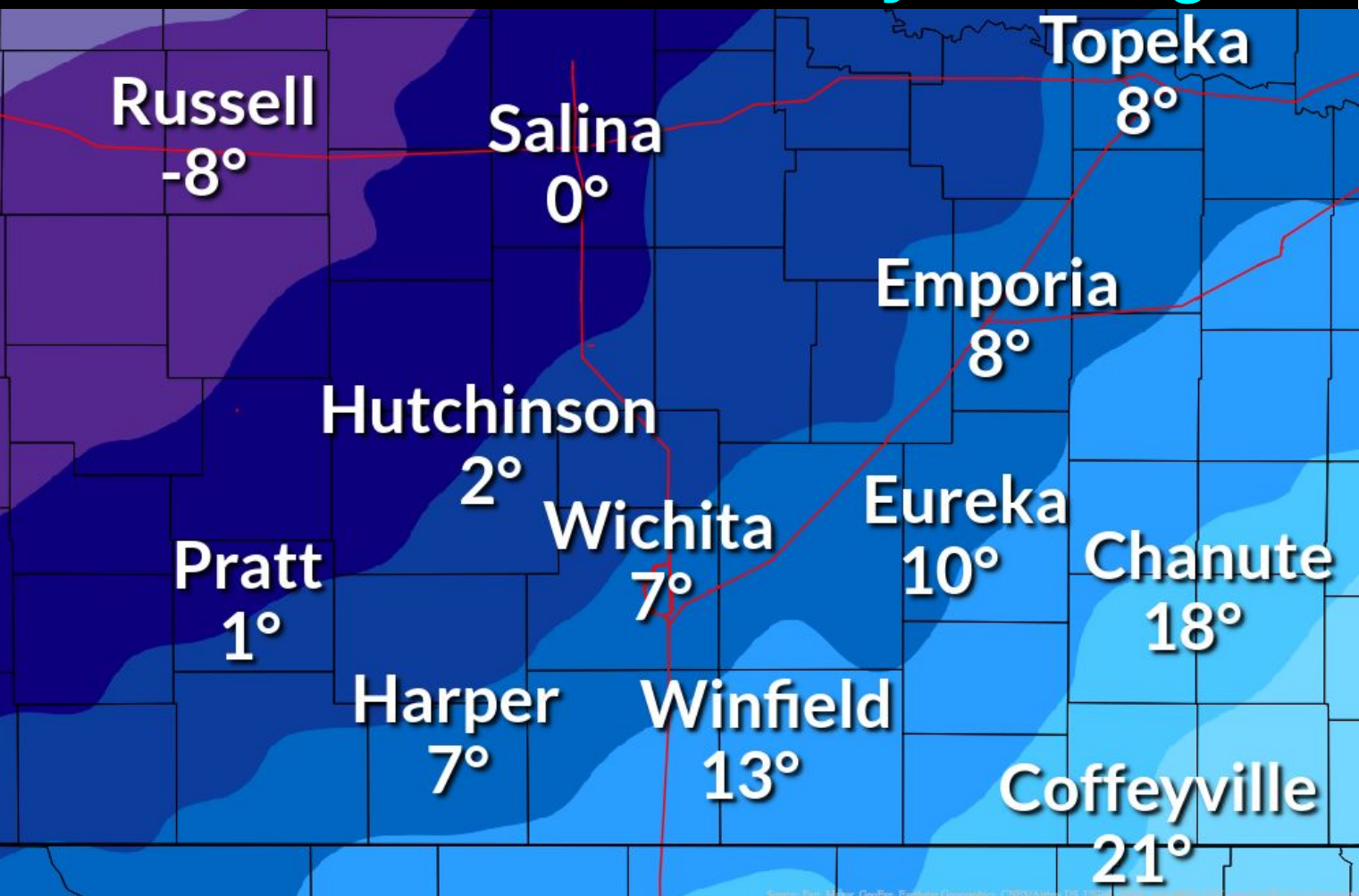




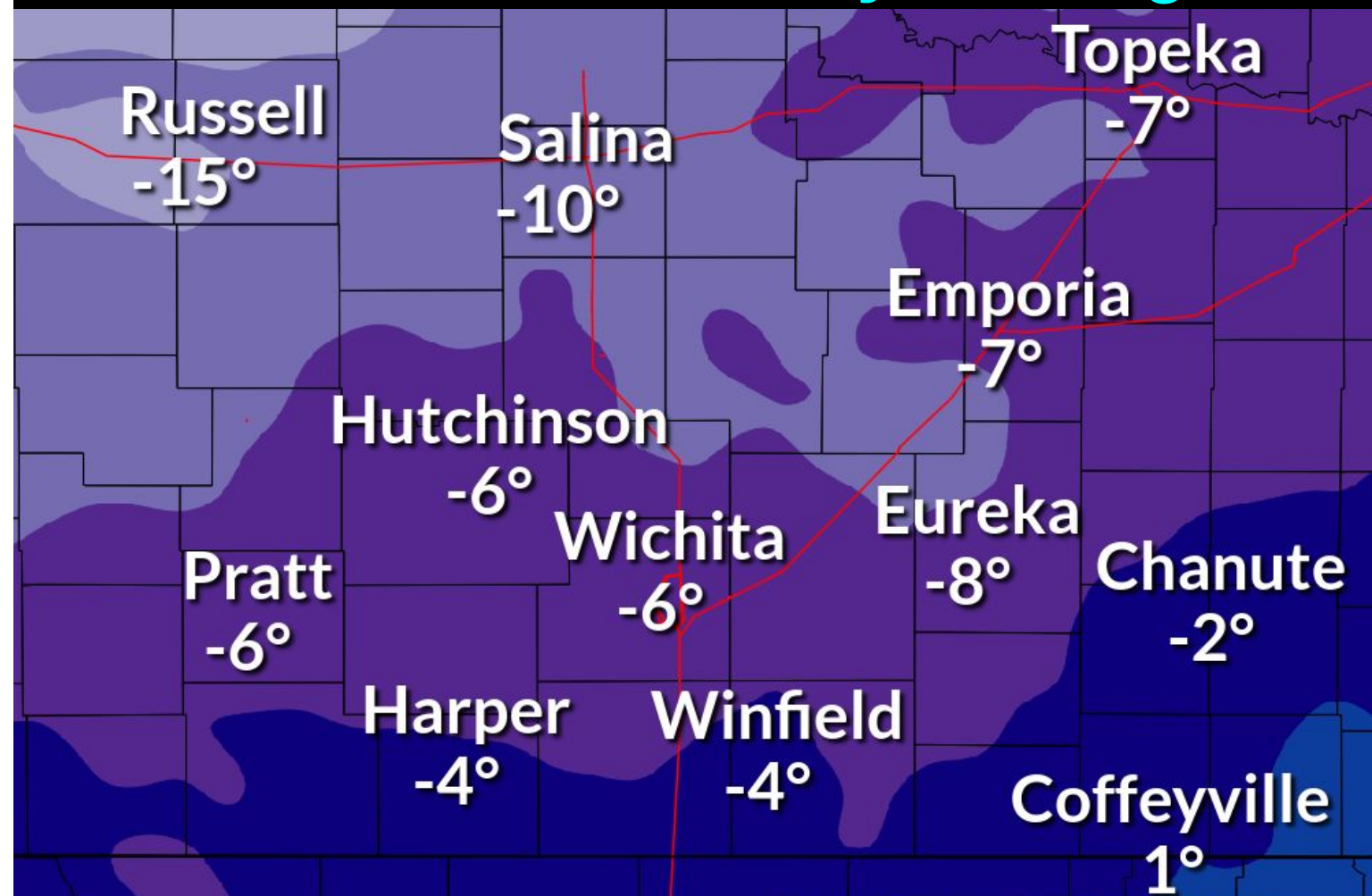
