










# **Heavy Rainfall Probabilities**



# **Forecast Confidence: Heavy Rainfall Risk**

### Location

**High Medium** Low Confidence is medium-high that southeast Kansas will see the highest rainfall amounts. Timing **High Medium** Low Confidence is medium-high that the greatest potential for heavy rainfall will be during the overnight through early morning hours tonight through Monday night.

## Magnitude



Confidence is medium-high that excessive rainfall will lead to flooding, especially over southeast Kansas, with the potential for modest to significant rises in area rivers.
