COVID 19 Decision Tree – STUDENTS

Common Symptoms Α

- Fever (Over 100.4°F)
- Loss of smell or taste
- Cough
- Unexplained muscle aches
- Sore throat

- Shortness of breath
- Chills
- New or unusual headache
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or loss of appetite

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

- 1. Notify administrator of result
- Continue medical care as instructed
- 3. **Symptomatic:** Stay home and away from others for five (5) days from the date your symptoms began. Students can return to school on day 6 if fever-free for 24 hours and symptoms are improving.
- 4. **Asymptomatic:** Stay home and away from others for five (5) days from the date of your positive test. Student can return to school on day 6 if fever-free for 24 hours and symptoms, if any develop, are improving. Day 0 = the date of positive test if you are symptomatic.
- 5. Per FL-DOH, face masks are no longer required; this is a parent decision.

ADMINISTRATOR WILL

- 1. Notify Pastor (if applicable) & OCSC
- 2. Send general communication to staff and parent community is optional.
- Complete the OCSC COVID-19 Reporting Form

If Student Tests Negative



STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

- 1. Notify Administrator of result (copy of results to administrator)
- 2. Continue medical care as instructed
- 3. Return to school after 24 hours have passed since recovery (No fever and general improvement of symptoms)

Yes, there was direct physical or close contact within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more where within 24 hours.

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

- Notify administrator
- 2. Contact child's physician
- 3. Monitor by checking for fever and symptoms
- **Symptomatic:** Stay home and go to Section B
- Asymptomatic student: Child does not need to quarantine, however, continue to monitor for symptoms for 10 days after exposure
- 6. If the student becomes symptomatic following exposure to an individual that has tested positive for COVID-19, go to Section B

ADMINISTRATOR WILL

- Notify Pastor (if applicable) & OCSC
- 2. Communicate with parents about when child can return to school
- 3. Follow directives for "If Student Tests positive" or "If Student Tests Negative"

G No, the student is unaware of any contact with someone who is infected or diagnosed with Covid-19

STUDENTS/PARENTS WILL

1. Continue practicing social distancing, good hygiene, and other preventative measures as directed by the school and CDC

ADMINISTRATOR WILL

1. No specific action is needed

FACE MASKS:

Whether or not a child wears a mask in a school/ECC should be up to the child's parent or legal guardian.
