SUMMER PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

All of our sessions are supported by a number of generous donors, including the Leo M. Traditional Day & Overnight Programs (Young Adults and Adults)

Traditional Day & Overnight Programs (Kids, Teens, and Young Adults)

Traditional day and overnight programs provide independent living skills and executive functioning, all while having so much fun. The sessions vary in length and start date, giving participants, parents, and caregivers the opportunity to select programs that match their interests and lifestyles. Activities will be themed to each session and will include culinary arts (emphasizing farm-to-table education), hiking, music, sports and physical fitness, dramatic arts, creative arts, and more. For overnights, check-in times will be from 10:00am-12:00pm on the first day and check-out times will run from 1:00-3:00pm on the last day. Every session has the option to select day programs which will run from 9:00am-6:00pm every day of the program.

Travel Camp (Young Adults and Adults)

Travel camps give participants the chance to spend time exploring their own local community and beyond by experiencing overnight trips in a safe, nurturing environment. Check-in is from 10:00-11:00am on the first day and check-out is from 5:00-6:00pm on the last day. These opportunities are tailored to fit the needs of 3:1 participants. Those with a 2:1 ratio may be evaluated on a case-by-case basis to determine eligibility. There is no option for day program or for those requiring a 1:1 ratio. All participants, regardless of ratio, will need to be approved in order to enroll.

Adventures in Life Readiness

Adventures in Life Readiness programs are for 3:1 adults, ages 16+ with developmental and/or physical disabilities who are ready to master relevant knowledge, skills, and attitudes for working at Via West in preparation for community work settings. Participants will assist with camp programming. They will also be coached on vocational scenarios, practice executive functioning skills, social norms, and household management skills. To enroll, participants must have completed at least two summer and/or weekend sessions within the past five years. These sessions run concurrently with select traditional overnight programs. Check-in times will be from 10:00am-12:00pm on the first day and check-out times will run from 1:00-3:00pm on the last day. Participants must be approved in order to enroll.



Altitude

ALTITUDE Altitude is for participants who can function in a 3:1 ratio, have conversational language skills, are not currently struggling with any significant behavioral challenges, and are typically in a main stream classroom setting. Checkin for Sleepaway, Getaway, and Mad Science will be from 10:00am-12:00pm on the first day and check-out will run from 1:00-3:00pm on the last day. Check-in for Travel Camp will be from 10:00-11:00am on the first day and check-out will run from 5:00-6:00pm on the last day. Mini Altitude runs from 9:00am-6:00pm M-F.

Adventures in Life Planning

Adventures in Life Planning programs are for Altitude participants, ages 18-28, who are ready to learn valuable organizational and mentorship skills. Participants will practice social skill nuances, build executive functioning independence, train in career readiness skills, and assist with camp programming, including Altitude's unique economy. Check-in will be from 10:00am-12:00pm on the first day and check-out will run from 1:00-3:00pm on the last day. Participants must be approved in order to enroll.

Our Adaptive Swim Lessons for children, teens, young adults, and adults run during select summer Via West sessions. Each clinic is comprised of 4 sessions that are each 45 minutes in length. We will be offering 2 different types of clinics. Beginner lessons will include getting acquainted with water, working on submerging your head under water, beginning front and back floats with assistance, and beginning kicking with assistance. Intermediate lessons are for those already comfortable in the water that can do a front float unassisted. These lessons include working on different swim strokes and learning to tread water in the deep end.

Science Camp

Special needs science camps provide an opportunity for students from special needs schools/organizations to have fun while gaining valuable knowledge and hands-on experience from interactive and sensory driven learning. Students will partake in field days and overnight camp excursions and enjoy activities like horseback riding, discovery walks, culinary rotations, creek exploration, night hikes, dances, and more. 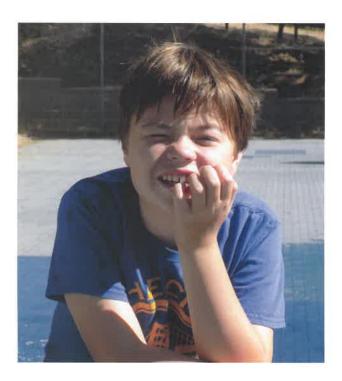


3 days August 16–18, 2019 (FRI–SUN)

Altitude offers summer camp experiences for boys and girls with social cognitive challenges including verbal and nonverbal learning disabilities, ADHD, Asperger's, and high functioning autism. Altitude is a place where participants build social skills, independence and self-confidence. We offer a fun summer vacation where friendships are developed. With warmth, guidance, and ongoing support, we prepare our participants for the transition to young adulthood, future relationships, and the rest of their lives!

The Altitude participant has back-and-forth conversational skills, is not currently struggling with any significant behavioral challenges, and is typically independent within a mainstream classroom setting. Our intake process involves a face-to-face interview with each prospective participant, and we will also check two references—these are professionals whom the family trusts and are often teachers and therapists.

Altitude offers a 3:1 staff-to-participant ratio. Our participants learn through an organic process, in which our staff recognizes significant learning opportunities while the participants engage in fun, traditional camp activities such as swimming, athletics, art, drama, and more.

Summer Transportation

We are so excited to expand our transportation offerings to now include 10 locations across the Bay Area. All vans will have both a Senior Via West Counselor and Nurse on board. 1:1 participants will have their assigned counselor riding with them. Check-in will occur with both the counseling staff as well as the nursing staff. Special diet information will be given to the nursing staff as well. Remaining payments and paperwork, if any, will need to be rendered at the designated check-in location. It is very important that parents bring all packing list items as you would if you were bringing the participant to the campus directly. None of the processes will change. It will be the parent/caregiver's responsibility to ensure that the participant is changed and fed as the ride may be up to 90 minutes depending on location and traffic.

We will be providing transportation for \$50.00 each way from San Jose, Santa Clara, and Palo Alto; \$75.00 each

way from Fremont, Santa Cruz, and Morgan Hill; \$100 each way from South San Francisco, Oakland, and Salinas; \$125.00 each way from Santa Rosa. All pickups for checkin days will occur between 10:30am–12:00pm, and your specific pickup time will be prearranged and discussed with you prior to check-in day. Drop off times will be between 12:00pm–1:30pm and will also be prearranged ahead of time.

Our vans will remain at the designated locations for 20 minutes after the pickup and drop off time frames before leaving to return to Via West Campus. If you miss your scheduled pickup or drop off time, you will be charged a fee of \$100. If you miss your drop off time, you will need to pick your participant up from Via West Campus where our regular late pickup policy will be in effect.

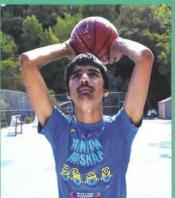
