



MULTI-HAZARD POST-DISASTER SAFETY ASSESSMENT PROGRAM EVALUATOR TRAINING

Disaster Service Worker Volunteer

The Safety Assessment Program (SAP) provides professional resources to local governments to help with the safety evaluation of buildings and infrastructure after a disaster. The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal-OES) manages the program in cooperation with partnering professional organizations. Trained evaluators are essential in the first days after a destructive event to review the safety of potentially damaged structures. After successfully completing the SAP training, eligible licensed/certified professionals will be issued a Cal-OES SAP ID card. This training is nationally recognized. SAP has been successfully utilized after earthquakes, firestorms, floods, and through the interstate Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) has helped local governments in Louisiana and Mississippi after Hurricane Katrina. - Licensed civil, structural, geotechnical engineers (any state).
- Licensed architects (any state).
- Registered geologists and engineering geologists.
- ICC and ACIA certified inspectors.
- DSA and OSHPD inspectors.
