



# THIS IS HOW WE DIE

**Based on and Using the DVD Series “This is How People Die” featuring Barbara Karnes, RN and Hospice Pioneer, followed by discussion**

Nurses often have the privilege of supporting someone who is dying and/or their family. At those times, the goal is to provide comfort and compassion in the dying process. This series will better equip the nurse to offer care and presence to an individual and family during the dying process.

Barbara Karnes is a RN, hospice pioneer, and award-winning end of life educator. She authored the books *Gone From My Sight*, *The Dying Experience*, *the Eleventh Hour*, *A Caring Guideline for Hours to Minutes Before Death*, *A Time to Live: Living with a Life-threatening Illness*, *My Friend, I Care: The Grief Experience*, and *How Do I know You? Dementia at the End of Life*. Barbara has her own blog, *Something to Think About*, an opportunity to look at living and dying from a different perspective.
