A Faithful Response: Speaking Up for Our Neighbors

Many of you have heard about the proposed detention facility being built in the Everglades—commonly called "Alligator Alcatraz." This news has raised deep concern among people of faith throughout our synod. Whether you lean conservative or liberal, you may feel compelled to respond out of your Christian commitment to uphold human dignity, protect the vulnerable, and care for God's creation.

In the Florida-Bahamas Synod, we hold space for faithful people with different political perspectives who share a common call to act with compassion. If you feel led to respond, there are faithful ways to do so--grounded in prayer, advocacy, and public witness.

1. Reach Out to Your Elected Leaders
