

March 8-9<sup>th</sup>, 2025 (Register by February 7<sup>th</sup>)

**NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY:** This course will survey the New Testament scriptures and explore the inspiration, authorship, context, and criteria used to determine which books became part of our canon. Participants will develop a deeper understanding of NT themes and early Christian theology and examine how contemporary Christians interpret Old Testament (*Hebrew*) scriptures through a Christian lens.



<u>Pre-course assignment:</u> Participants are required to acquire <u>The New Testament</u>, <u>A Student's Introduction</u> by Stephen L. Harris and read the text alongside the <u>New Testament</u> in their Bibles. Led by Rev. Cathy Belles, pastor of Henry Memorial Presbyterian Church, Dublin, GA.



**ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF WORSHIP:** This course focuses on what constitutes faithful Christian worship and explores the theological underpinnings of the key elements of worship including scripture, confession, prayer, music, sacraments, and sermon. Participants will learn to think critically about each element of worship and will dive into some tenets within Reformed theology.

<u>Pre-course assignment:</u> Participants are required to read *A More Profound Alleluia; Theology and Worship in Harmony* by Leanne Van Dyk. The course

is led by Rev. Rick Douylliez, Savannah Presbytery's Director of Pastoral and Ecclesial Care and longtime pastor of First Presbyterian, St. Marys, GA.

<u>ELECTIVE COURSE</u>: We welcome back much beloved **Dr. Christine** Yoder, Senior Vice President and Dean of Faculty and J. McDowell Richards Professor of Biblical Interpretation at Columbia Theological Seminary.



<u>THE TREE OF LIFE</u>; An Introduction to the Wisdom Literature of Ancient Israel. This course is an introduction to the wisdom literature of ancient Israel, especially the books of Proverbs, Job, and Ecclesiastes. Our goals are to consider the

definition and key characteristics of wisdom; to develop a familiarity with the background, forms, content, theologies, and interpretive issues of the wisdom texts; and to reflect on the place of wisdom in the Christian Scriptures. Furthermore, we will explore the relevance of wisdom's perspectives for contemporary preaching, teaching, and theological reflection in Christian communities.

<u>Pre-course assignment:</u> To read <u>Proverbs</u>, <u>Job & Ecclesiastes</u> and make note of what stands out to you, what surprises you, how you would describe each book to someone who had never read it, how the books are similar and how they are different. <u>Additional recommended reading:</u> Samuel E. Balentine, <u>Wisdom Literature</u>. Core Biblical Studies, Abingdon, 2018; William P. Brown, <u>Wisdom's Wonder: Character, Creation, and Crisis in the Bible's Wisdom Literature</u>. Eerdmans, 2014.

All courses are open to anyone who would like to participate.
