The Jamie Hulley Arts Foundation was created in 2002 in memory of 20 year old Orange CT resident, Jamie Elaine Hulley. Jamie was a creative soul who had the gift of seeing the world as a thing of beauty and of making all who knew her feel special. Jamie's curiosity was insatiable, her laugh infectious, and her love of taking artistic risks unlimited. Her life's motto was "*what would I want with small dreams?*" The mission of Jamie's Foundation is to provide educational opportunities in the arts to young artists and early career professionals so that they can develop their talents and pursue their dreams.

Jamie Hulley Arts Foundation Programs:

- ✧ Scholarship Opportunities: 4-year college scholarships in the visual & performing arts for Amity High School students; talent development scholarships for area youth to study the visual & performing arts; summer theater camp scholarships; and college scholarships awarded at the Stephen Sondheim CT High School Musical Theater Awards and at Square Foot Theatre.
- ✧ Educational Programs for Schools: These programs seek to enhance the traditional curriculum through the arts by having working artists, painters, sculptors, musicians, actors, storytellers, poets, dancers, film makers, etc. from the local community share their talents with teachers and students. School recipients thus far: Ansonia, Bethany, Bridgeport, Derby, East Haven, Fairfield, Hamden, Hartford, Milford, New Haven, North Haven, Orange, Shelton, Stratford, Trumbull, West Haven & Woodbridge.
- ✧ Early Career Special Project Awards: Assistance to young professionals for creative project ideas.
- ✧ Community Project Sponsorship: Assistance to art-focused non-profits for special projects.
- ✧ Jamie Hulley Legacy Awards: Special awards given at places that were influential in Jamie's growth as an artist ... Race Brook School (Orange), Amity Middle School (Orange), Amity High School (Woodbridge), Lee Lund Dance Studio (Milford), and Wesleyan University (Middletown)

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

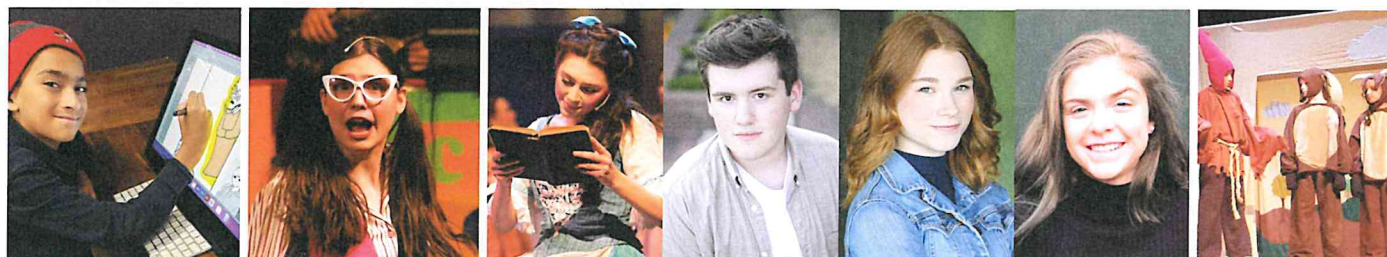
These programs are designed to enhance the traditional curriculum through the integration of the arts. Through our visiting artist opportunities, working artists from all genres — painters, actors, dancers, storytellers, musicians, filmmakers, sculptors, poets, etc. — are able to share their expertise with students and teachers.

We have funded 298 educational programs since 2007.



SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

- ✦ In the past 21 years, 39 students have benefitted from our four-year college scholarship program in the visual & performing arts
- ✦ 201 local youth attended summer theater camp with full scholarships
- ✦ Each year, area youth enjoy weekly lessons in the performing arts through our Talent Development Scholarships; 3 young artists sponsored in 2023
- ✦ Since 2018, \$1,000 college scholarships have been awarded to 22 high school actors at the annual Stephen Sondheim Musical Theater Awards & to 2 actors at Square Foot Theatre
- ✦ Jamie Hulley Theater Internship Program at Broadway Method Academy sponsored 6 aspiring theater professionals in 2023 and 10 since 2022

- ✦ Broadway Method Academy's Creative Partner since 2014

- ✦ School Readiness through Dance Project at Hall Neighborhood House since 2019
