Around the Capitol

State Government Committee Update

For this week's meeting of the State Government Committee, we **toured the Pennsylvania State Archives** building in Harrisburg. Its new location is double the size and officially opened in December.

Established in 1903, the State Archives preserves valuable public records from our state government so they can be available for people to study, and to keep a historic record of the commonwealth.



The State Archives currently houses about 250,000,000 documents of all kinds, from those that establish the commonwealth's boundaries to those that document changes to our environment and laws – such as the original document from 1780 that proposes a law to abolish slavery in Pennsylvania.

Anybody can visit the State Archives; the documents belong to the people of Pennsylvania and are open to all! You can **study your family's past, research the history of your house,** or simply browse. It's open weekly, Wednesday through Saturday, 9 a.m. – 4 p.m., and located at 1681 N. Sixth St., Harrisburg.

The staff periodically hold public education events: coming up on May 22nd, the head of the Public Services Section will hold a [presentation to explain the Archives' genealogical resources](#) and how you can use them to investigate your ancestry.

A day of joyful energy throughout the building for everyone present. I'd also like to specially thank **Bickel's Snack Foods** for representing the 95th District with snacks for the children.

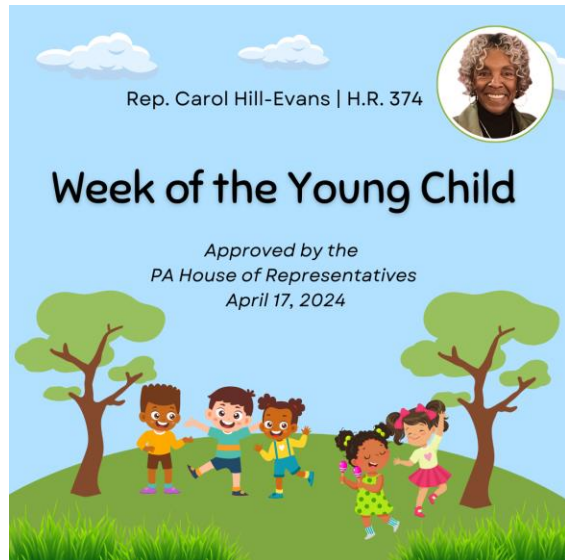
