Preble Street Teen Center - Preble Street Teen Services meets the urgent needs of homeless and runaway youth — providing warmth and safety, nutritious meals, clothing, crisis intervention, and overnight shelter. The Preble Street Teen Center is the hub of services for homeless and runaway youth, providing immediate access and an acclaimed service coordination model.

Poor People's Campaign - The Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival is uniting people across Maine to challenge the evils of systemic racism, poverty, the war economy, ecological devastation and the nation's distorted morality of religious nationalism.

Youth and Family Outreach - Youth and Family Outreach has a rich, unwavering history of meeting the needs of Portland's children and families. Since its origins in 1844 as a community outreach mission of the Portland Ministries at Large, the agency has focused its efforts on serving the community with compassion. YFO currently operates an early care and education facility which was established in 1986.

Learning Works - LearningWorks is committed to strengthening the communities we serve by providing free community-based education programs for children, adults, and families throughout Southern Maine. Our primary goal is to support academic and personal success for our neighbors who lack resources and/or fall outside traditional educational structures.

MUUSAN - The Maine Unitarian Universalist State Advocacy Network (MUUSAN) is a statewide advocacy and public policy network anchored in our Unitarian Universalist faith and animated by its principles. This legislative ministry links Maine's 22 Unitarian Universalist congregations to promote just, humane laws and policies in keeping with our UUA Seven Principles. We welcome as partners and collaborators all those who share our values.

The Maine Council of Churches - Representing seven denominations of churches, the members of the Maine Council of Churches act as one voice to advocate for the disenfranchised, the downtrodden and the protection of God's creation. It spreads its message by working with partner organizations throughout the state, volunteers and parishioners in our 550 churches. Begun in 1938, today it is a reliable and effective voice against torture, hunger and poverty and an advocate for justice, compassion and peace.
