COVID UPDATE ON CHURCH PROGRAMMING

In the past week, COVID infection numbers across the country have far surpassed any prior levels. This reality has been reflected in the church's staff as well as others who work in the building. Including the Nursery School, roughly a third of the people employed by the church are currently COVID positive or their spouse is COVID positive. It is our fervent hope and prayer that all of them will quickly and fully recover from their illness.

Because of the large number of staff illnesses, it is not possible for the church to continue full operations. In particular, indoor worship services require a great deal of staff support and are not currently possible. So for the time being, we will hold Sunday morning services on YouTube, which the ministers and music staff will prerecord. Dolores Register's memorial service has been relocated. It will still be held this Saturday at noon, but will be hosted at the Nineteenth Century Club.

In addition, we are not able to open the building outside of daytime business hours—and if you need to come by the church during the day, we ask that you please call ahead to make sure our administrative staff is available. Any team meetings or other church programming that was scheduled to be held in the building will now be held on Zoom. If you need help setting up a Zoom meeting, please reach out to Heather Vanderberg.

In truth, this turn of events is very humbling. I had been quite proud of the precautions our community had taken. I had felt that the relatively low number of illnesses in our community showed that we had done a good job. And I suppose that is still true. However, in the past few weeks, I have lost count of the number of members who have fallen ill with COVID. I make phone calls now every day to check in on people, and the number grows day to day. As I said, it is humbling.

If you or anyone in your household becomes ill, please do let me know. We want to know about one another's trials and difficulties. We want to hold one another in prayer. We want to pray for each other by name, as we continue to pray that this wave of infections should spare us and our neighbors the worst ravages of the past years.
