He is no longer in the humble manger; but by His own promise He is in the humble means of bread and wine of the Lord's Supper with His true body and blood. As we receive His gift, the greatest gift we can give to others is a loving witness to the truth of His Word. For this reason anyone who is not yet instructed, in doubt, or who holds a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desires to receive this sacrament, is asked to first speak with one of the pastors.

# CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

As we draw near to the newborn Christ child, we enter into the presence of holiness. Gathered around His manger, we look upon His face as unworthy guests. Yes, His very presence in our world testifies to God's love for us. He earnestly desired to bring an end to our struggle with sin that offends and opposes His Word.

In His grace, He grants us forgiveness of our sin. Confident in the love God has shown toward us through Christ Jesus, we confess our sins of thought, word, and deed, taking refuge in God's infinite mercy, and imploring His grace for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ.

- Merciful Father, we humbly bow before You in the gift of Your only begotten Son. We confess that it is also our sins which make necessary Christ's coming to this earth. We have been loveless and selfish. We have gone our own way instead of Your way. Grant us the peace which the newborn Savior brings to all who believe in Him.

#### NICENE CREED
