Carols of the British Isles

This collection of eight carols from the British Isles showcases some favorites in a new way. All settings are very appropriate to the texts, especially the setting of the SUSSEX CAROL. This piece includes five variations all based on part of the text. There is a Theme, Air, Pavane, Pastorale, and Gigue Fugue. The lively Gigue is based on the text, "News of great joy, news of great mirth!"

The Christmas Fantasy is a very interesting new duet that incorporates many of the familiar tunes of the season. This medium-difficulty piece would make a great piece for Christmas Eve, or the following Sundays. Included in the piece are IN DULCI JUBILO, SUSSEX CAROL, MENDELSSOHN, AND ANTIOCH. The piece also makes full use of all the resources of the organ from the strings to full organ. I will be including this in my Christmas Eve selections this year!
