Baker currently works as Multimedia Coordinator for the Ventura County Star. He works with sales reps, digital and print teams, as well as directly with clients, to develop, implement and refine advertising campaigns. It's a job he loves.

He's also applying to CI's Extended University M.B.A. program.

"A master's degree will help me stand out in a very competitive field," says Baker. "Also, CI made me like school for the first time. I miss it."
