The Talmud teaches a famous story about Rabbi Elazar that concludes with the moral: "A person should always be soft like a reed and not hard like a cedar... And it was for this reason that the reed merited to have pens

drawn from its ranks to be used to write Torah scrolls, Tefillin, and Mezuzot." (Ta'anit 20b) Why is it a positive trait to be open-minded? I learned the lesson this past November.

When I married Blair, I recognized that I was marrying a lover of dogs (and humanity). On the other hand, I did not grow up having pets. In turn, I resisted getting a dog—refused is probably more like it. As much as I thought we had settled the matter, we have three children who love dogs. ourselves anew. Change is good, sometimes... Even if I have to wake up at 5am to walk her.

From the President

Welcome to our second quarterly Kol HaShalom newsletter. You will see in these pages that we have had a very busy

couple of months since the 5779 High Holidays. I hope we will see you at upcoming services, holiday celebrations, Jewgle events and the January Shabbaton that will bring us together at Camp Alonim with Rabbi Lebovitz and Cantor Dale Schatz.

As you know, I have been Adat Shalom's Board President for a long time, beginning in July 2014. The Nominating Committee asked me then to come in and lead our board at a time when we needed to make hard decisions and implement changes to assure our congregation's financial health and continuation. Change and uncertainty are difficult for individuals and for a community. But change we did, and gradually the uncertainty receded, and we found the right rabbi to move us forward. We are a stronger community in every way today because we were brave enough to transform together.

A vibrant synagogue must have a strong board with more than one willing and capable leader. Today, I am grateful that leadership is blossoming at Adat Shalom. So, it is time for another change. On December 2, we elected Janet Schulman Trask to succeed me as president and Elana Dixon to replace Janet as Executive Vice President. I will assume the role of Immediate Past President and our former IPP, Esther Margulies, will stay on the Board as a member. We welcomed new board members: Carin Schachat, Allan Cohen, and Beth Ojena, and renewed David Shemano and David Factor for new terms. Other board members and officers have continuing terms through 2019.

Long-time board member, Barry Bar-El, is stepping down after more than a decade. I personally can't thank him enough for supporting me these past 4½ years and for all his contributions as a board member. During Adat Shalom's year of lay-led services (2015/16), Barry was committed to fulfilling the promise that Adat Shalom's doors would be open every Shabbat. He organized and led services, spearheaded the first Rabbi in Residence program, and stepped in to do whatever was needed during Chaim's illness and after his sad passing. Barry was a founding member of the Asset Management Committee and served on several nominating committees and two rabbi search committees. On behalf of the Adat Shalom community, thank you for all you have done for this synagogue.

Janet Schulman Trask is a natural to serve as our next Board President. As Vice President, she has already contributed much to our current governance and development initiatives. In the coming year, expect to see the growth of our Ner Tamid Society (planned legacy giving). Expect the installation of the new Yartzheit board, a beautiful art piece that will replace the existing boards, preserving every name and providing opportunities to honor departed loved ones. Expect events led by our Community Committee chairs, Marla Knoll and Judy Paz, and supported (we hope) by a growing number of volunteers taking on the large and small tasks that make a synagogue work. And expect a continuing board partnership with Rabbi Lebovitz to build up our religious school and foster a welcoming and spiritual Jewish home for all who enter.

Lastly, expect Barry and me to be active members of Adat Shalom. It was great to see so many of you at the Congregational Meeting.

New Yahrzeit Boards: Artwork to Enhance Adat Shalom's Sanctuary

About five years ago, Adat Shalom's master planning process suggested some measures to brighten the hallway and make it more welcoming, including reconsidering the format and locations of the Yahrzeit boards. The plan identified that any change would need to respect our commitment to maintaining the memories and recognition incorporated into these boards, and continuing to offer opportunities for future dedications.

We are excited that we have now launched a project that will not only brighten up the hallway, but will also add a beautiful art piece to the sanctuary. Based on the stained glass reflected through the Aron Kodesh, the new Yahrzeit board, to be located as shown in this rendering, will contain etched glass plaques replacing each existing brass plaque, with room for another 500 plaques. The removed brass plaques will be returned to families. Any existing "reserved" plaques will

also be honored. Although donations will be welcome, no cost will be charged for the transfer.

This project has been made possible by a generous donation by the Hess family in memory of Leonard Hess. With their support, the project will be implemented by Shavuot. The balance of the project's funding is expected to come from the purchase of new plaques. Plaques are now available for purchase at an early-bird price of \$540 (until April 18). The regular plaque price has been set at \$650.

We are grateful to Esther Margulies and Richard Destin for spearheading this project and working with the artist-designer, Jerry Siegel of Yahrzeitronix, to create a unique and beautiful installation to remember our loved ones in perpetuity. Thank you, also, to Rabbi Lebovitz, for the dedication you have shown to make this project happen.

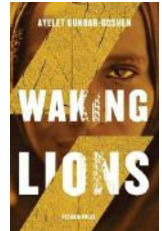

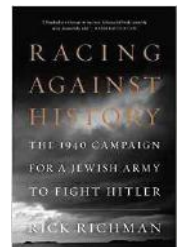
