Each year, we as a community seek new ways to connect with Israel. Years ago, we helped rebuild Kehillat Moriah in Haifa after the fires. This year, we set out to feed the hungry in Israel through our support of Leket. We will

be welcoming Joseph Gitler, the Founder and Chairman of Leket, into our community on Shabbat, March 28th. I hope you will mark your calendars to join us.

Another way in which we can impact Israel for the better is the current World Zionist Congress elections. As many of you have already heard from the *bimah*, elections are underway for the next congress in Jerusalem in the Fall, 2020. I have had the pleasure of sitting on the national board of MERCAZ, proudly serving as a MERCAZ delegate at the 2015 World Zionist Congress in Jerusalem, and also participating in the Rabbinic Steering Council for these current elections. I am once again on the slate of delegates for MERCAZ and have already committed to serving if enough delegates are elected.

As Conservative Jews, it is to our benefit to elect as many delegates as possible from our slate to participate. Representation in Israeli government posts and funding for the Masorti (Conservative) movement in Israel are dependent on the elections and results from the next World Zionist Congress. We had a disappointing showing four years ago and we are looking to increase our vote dramatically. Voting MERCAZ is our voice in Israel in support of religious pluralism, democracy, and the strengthening of the connection between Israel and the Diaspora.

I implore you to please take a few moments and vote for MERCAZ by following the steps in the box below. Thank you to all who have taken the time to vote, and please tell all of your friends and family as well.

activities, and other events. The joyful Kabbalat Shabbat dinner on Sukkot drew more than 150 people in the beautiful *sukkah* built by the Men's Club. Yael Hartstein and Lisa Schechter led a well-attended book discussion on Yom Kippur and Blair Lebovitz and Orley Garber led children's activities throughout the entire High Holidays.

Our new Yahrzeit Board is a stunning piece of artwork—a legacy to our loved ones and an opportunity to remember our families in the future. Richard Destin and Esther Margulies led the effort with the help of many volunteers. Thank you to Jerry Siegal for creating such a beautiful piece of art.

Hanukah was quickly upon us after the Holidays. On December 29, a large crowd gathered as Adat Shalom lit the 8th candle on the Menorah on the 3rd Street Promenade, with Rabbi and Cantor Dale leading the prayers and singing. Marla Knoll led our annual Hanukah Angels program in support of Chai Lifeline. Religious School students, parents, and volunteers spent the day wrapping presents for needy families.

Our *Hesed* program led by Marla Knoll and Natalie Stanger, provides transportation to shul events and services and meals for *Shiva*, families with new babies, and those who are ill. Our program "A Place at the Table" brings people together to share a Sabbath meal, coordinated by Liz Bar-El.

Our Israel Social Action Committee, led by Allan Cohen, is building a strong relationship with Leket Israel, an organization which focuses on food inequality in Israel. During the High Holidays we raised more than \$12,000 which will provide a great deal of support to the Leket mission.

The Shabbaton on January 10-12 was a rousing success with 100 people attending, including more than 20 children. It was a spiritual, social, and educational experience and was enjoyed immensely by all. Next year's Shabbaton has already been booked for January 8-10, 2021.

I want to recognize Judy Paz and Naomi Friedman, who stepped down from the Board this year and remain active and engaged. Our two new Board members, Mitchell Gossett and Orley Garber, bring many talents and skills to Adat Shalom. We welcome them to the Board of Directors.

Adat Shalom is a robust shul and we will continue to grow our membership, meet the needs of new and long-standing congregants and become the centerpiece of Judaism in West Los Angeles.

Everyone crowded under the *schach* for *kiddush* and *motzi*, chanted by Rabbi Lebovitz and Cantor Schatz, on a warm, fall evening. Cesar expertly added tables and more tables, around the *sukkah* and there was a seat everyone.

Fast forward to January 2020 and my first Shabbaton! Brandeis Bardin did not disappoint! The weather was magnificent. The services, the programming, and lighting Shabbat candles together with over 100 Adat Shalom members were unforgettable. OPERATION PB&J

One of the main ways we are required to celebrate Purim is to give to the poor ("Matanot L'Evyonim"). On any given night, there are over 50,000 homeless men, women and children in Los Angeles. On Purim night, we will make PB&J sandwiches and assemble survival kits for the homeless which will be delivered on Purim day. We hope to make this a yearly tradition at Adat Shalom when we, alongside other synagogues in our community, take on the responsibility to help take care of the homeless in our midst. Our goal is to make and deliver at least 50 kits at a cost of \$10 each.

Masorti Movement Protecting Our Rights in Israel

As new members, we were attracted to the Zionist atmosphere of Adat Shalom from the start, including the leadership of Rabbi Lebovitz with regards to Israel. Our synagogue's involvement with Leket is, of course, an expression of this commitment.

Rabbi Lebovitz asked me to write about my connection to Masorti (the Conservative branch of Israeli Judaism) as we gear up for the 38th World Zionist Congress. When I lived in Israel, I participated in several Masorti communities, Congregation Eshel Avraham in Beersheva, Kibbutz Hannaton in the Lower Galilee, and in Karmiel, at Kehillat Hakerem, where I met Liz and Barry Bar-El, who, unsurprisingly, were active members!

Back in the United States, the Conservative movement continued to be a big part of my life while raising my two children, Yael and Ezra. Subsequently, Ezra attended Nativ, the United Synagogue college leadership program in Israel, made *aliyah*, served in the IDF, and is now, himself, a social worker and the assistant director of Nativ's Yozma program.

The Masorti movement is working on the front lines to secure Israel's future as a Jewish, Zionist and democratic country. All streams of Jewish practice are empowered in Masorti, as are the civil and political rights of all the citizens of Israel. MERCAZ USA--The Voice of Conservative/Masorti Judaism, is on the slate at the 38th World Zionist Congress. The vote will be held between January 21 and March 18, and our own Rabbi Lebovitz could participate as a voting member if the slate gets enough votes. Leket - Israel Social Action Project

Our partnership with Leket Israel is going strong. Leket Israel provides excess fresh, nutritious food to over 200 nonprofit organizations throughout Israel, including senior centers, schools, social service programs, and soup kitchens free of charge. Leket feeds over 175,000 needy Israelis of all backgrounds, ethnicities and religions each week, including Holocaust survivors, youth at risk, single parent families, the working poor, and others.

A cornerstone of our partnership is involvement of Adat Shalom members. When visiting Israel, we have the

opportunity to volunteer with Leket by picking produce in fields or helping sort food at their distribution center in Ra'anana. During their December trip to Israel, Adat Shalom members Michael and Oren Wacht volunteered at the Ra'anana distribution center. According to Oren, "My dad and I went to Leket in Israel and sorted all the already picked bell peppers into smaller bins. We threw out the rotten ones. We did this at the same time another school group was there too. The people there were really nice and it felt good to do something helpful for other people while we were on our vacation." *Kol hakavod*, Oren.

On March 28, the CEO of Leket, Joseph Gitler, will join us Shabbat morning to talk more about the organization and how critical relationships with synagogues like ours contribute to their success. We hope you will join us for an inspirational morning.






Adat Shalom Book Club
