

Please be aware of several requests from the [Student Health Office](#):

- In light of risks associated with Covid-19, the NCS Student Health procedures summary has seen some revisions. The updated summary is available [here](#). The [Arizona Department of Health Services](#) has published a list of Covid-related immunization FAQ's [here](#).
- All students are required to have an updated [Emergency Form](#) and current copy of up-to-date immunizations in order to start school. If you are a returning student, you would have already filled out an updated emergency form as part of the re-enrollment process. If you are a new student, you will need to turn in a completed emergency form if you have not already done so.
- Is it possible to get an exemption from immunizations?
- Parents/guardians of K-12 students who wish to exempt their child(ren) from school-required immunizations for personal belief reasons must take the [ADHS Online Immunization Education Course](#) in order to obtain information about immunizations, including the risks and benefits of immunizations and the potential risks of non-immunization. The course will then generate a "[Personal Beliefs Exemption Form](#)" which indicates that they have viewed the required education, which the parent then signs and provides to the school.
- If your student is in preschool, you can simply complete the "[Religious Beliefs Exemption Form](#)".
- All students with EpiPens must have a [Food Allergy and Anaphylaxis Emergency Care Plan Form](#) filled out and signed by a doctor. This form must be on file in the health office along with the EpiPen prior to starting school.
- If you would like your student to have daily or "as needed" medications given, an unopened small bottle of the medication along with the med form needs to be dropped off to the health office. Please ensure the medication will not expire during the school year. Medications will be accepted any time during the school year. If you have any questions please feel free to call or email Nurse Anna. The med forms (Part A and B) are available [here](#).
- Medications (with Medication Forms A and B) and EpiPens (with the Food Allergy Anaphylaxis Emergency Care Plan Form) can be turned in on or by the first day of school. Medications can only be dropped off to Nurse Anna by an adult, they cannot be sent with a student.
