

CALL FOR POSTERS

Self-Help Counties Coalition's (SHCC) will once again be hosting a Poster Session during the 2025 Focus on the Future Conference, November 10 – 12, in Long Beach. A limited number of Poster Sessions will be selected for display and discussion at the 2025 meeting of our transportation professionals. Entries are encouraged from agencies, companies, and organizations with a focus on transportation. Non-profit organizations are encouraged to submit to bring awareness to their platforms. To enter, please review the criteria and complete the application form below no later than <u>Friday</u>, <u>October 3</u>. Selections will be made by <u>Friday</u>, <u>October 10</u>, and applicants will be notified via email.

Criteria and Relevance to Focus on the Future Audience: Posters need to focus on topics relevant to the SHCC's 25 local county transportation agencies and their partners delivering super majority voter-approved transportation sales tax measures throughout California. Topics need to be current (within 1-2 years).

To Apply: Complete and submit this application and return via email to Jenny Devine at <u>selfhelpcounties@gmail.com</u>. The SHCC Executive Director and the Focus on the Future Conference Planning Committee will review applications and make selections that best relate to the content and topics that are most relevant for the 2025 Focus on the Future Conference.

Selection Guidelines: Selection will be based on 1) Relevance of the topic submitted to the 2025 Focus on the Future; 2) Originality and quality of ideas; 3) Value of content and lessons learned to conference attendees; and 4) Completeness of application.

Poster Session applicants may submit with the reminder that member agencies are dedicated to keeping the faith of the voting public who provide the authority and the funding so that we may deliver the priority transportation projects that Californians depend upon every day. SHCC is dedicated to ensuring sound public policy so that the State of California can meet our transportation infrastructure needs. SHCC works closely with the California Transportation Commission, the California Department of Transportation, elected officials as well as other public and private sector interests. Marketing or sales materials or posters focused on promotion of a particular product or company will not be considered.

Poster and Station Logistics: We will be placing the project posters on a poster board display this year. Space allocations will allow for one poster on each side of the display. The maximum size of posters is 36" h x 48" w and should be unmounted (please to not mount on foam core). You will be responsible for finding your location and putting up your posters no later 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 9. Each poster station will be equipped a poster identification card and four tacks. Poster Sessions will be formally presented between 1:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 10, concurrent with mobile tours, and each selected poster must have a presenter available to discuss the poster with the audience at that time.

Electronic Submittals: All selected applicants will also need to submit an electronic version of their poster for display on the 2025 Focus on the Future virtual platform, Whova. Please let us know if you'd like to be considered for a brief interview about your poster to broadcast on our virtual platform.
