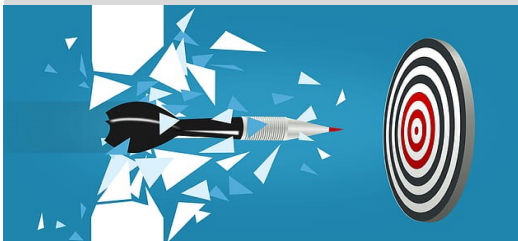


What to expect when attending a Reentry Simulation

The Reentry Simulation is designed to mimic one month in the life of an individual who has just been released from prison and is now on probation, post release, or parole. Much like the justice involved population, Reentry Simulation participants will attempt to navigate their way through the different agencies all while trying to remain in compliance with community supervision, take care of personal needs, and satisfy family obligations. The overwhelming nature of the process will be emphasized when participants are allotted only 15 minutes per week of the Simulation to complete all of the required task on the Life Card.

Helping the justice involved population overcome barriers and achieve goals with community support and guidance.



Facts...

- 95% of those incarcerated will be returning home.
- Nationally, approximately 70% of those released from prison will recidivate within three years. 30% of those released are re-arrested within the first six months.
- 60%-70% of those released from prison do not secure a job within the first year of release.
- Community Supervision violators account for 35% of prison admissions.
