

COVID-19 Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions at Camp Colley

NPI	Notes
Masking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Masking mandatory outside individual cabin group times Program facilitators will be masked during all activities and in all community spaces Administrative and leadership staff will be masked during all times when in community spaces
Sanitization	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hand sanitizer will be readily available at every activity station, group tent, restrooms, throughout dining halls, and on-hand of every staff member at all times Staff will remind campers of regularly scheduled sanitization times; hourly at a minimum
Handwashing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Handwashing stations will be increased for greater access Handwashing will occur between all activities, between meals, and before and after entering restrooms Tent groups will be assigned a designated handwashing station for their personal use
Taking Temperatures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Temperatures will be captured upon camper drop off, then daily throughout camp
Cohorting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Camper interaction will be reduced through cohort grouping; only certain tent groups will occupy the same physical space at camp at one time Groups will be limited in size to 40 campers at one time; 4 groups of 10 campers, all groups socially distanced by a minimum of 6 feet No all-camper activities will be facilitated
Social Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Enforce social distancing policies for vendors and other guests on camp property; no contact with campers, limited distanced contact with staff
Program Modifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Limit sharing of program equipment as much as possible 100% sanitization for all equipment between use
Mealtime Modifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cohorting during mealtimes; no all-camper meals, 40 campers max at one time 4 groups of 10 campers socially distanced during mealtimes All lunches will be prepared in way to be enjoyed with cabin group only outdoors Meals will be plated and served by designated kitchen staff All surfaces sanitized between each mealtime; complete dining hall sanitization 6 times daily Maximization of individually wrapped packaging (i.e. no shared condiment bottles)
Increased Ventilation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bus windows will remain down during entirety of trip to and from camp All building structures will maximize open windows and doors as greatly as possible
Testing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Information about free Phoenix COVID-19 testing sites will be shared with all registered families to encourage testing 3-5 days before the start of their camp session Staff will be required to be tested for COVID-19 3-5 days before arriving at the start of the summer season and will need to show a negative test to begin staff training Staff will be randomly tested throughout the summer on a lottery basis to ensure we catch any community spread of COVID-19 that may have entered camp Camp Colley will work to acquire rapid testing kits that will be administered to any campers of staff that is placed in medical isolation
Pre-Camp Quarantining	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Campers will be strongly encouraged to isolate at home for 3-5 days leading up to the start of their camp session to help prevent contracting COVID-19 after testing;

	<p>communications to families with outlined information about this process will be shared in advance of their session</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff will be required to isolate at home for 3-5 days leading up to the start of the season, and after arriving at Camp Colley will group isolate for 7 days throughout the staff training week
Isolation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Separate isolation tents will be utilized to immediately separate any campers and staff who demonstrate any symptoms of COVID-19; the person's health will be monitored by the camp nurse to measure any improvements and a rapid testing kit will be administered before reintroduction to the larger camp community • Isolation communications plan will be implemented to notify a camper's family of possible COVID-19 infection based on symptoms present • Campers in isolation will be given alternative activities throughout their time spent away from their group and will be cared for 2:1 by staff who will maintain distance and safety precautions to maintain their own health • For the safety of the remainder of camp, the group of which the participant experiencing symptoms will also quarantine away from the remainder of the camp population; a "shadow camp" will be facilitated so that the children can participate safely in all camp activities as planned
Limiting Outsiders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visitors will be strictly limited to necessary persons only and will be required to maintain all NPI protocols throughout their time at Camp Colley • All visitors must be approved by program director and/or executive director
Health Surveillance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Train staff on picking up on early warning signs of sick individuals • Check in with staff and participants on regular schedule to monitor any emerging symptoms of sickness • A health surveillance work sheet will be included in pre-camp informational email; worksheet monitors daily health, diet, etc. and is shared by the Camp Nurses Association
Identify Responsible Parties for Monitoring NPIs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As part of their weekly responsibilities, 1-2 float staff will be assigned to be the monitoring and upkeep of NPI supplies and implementation, including refilling soaps, sanitizers, use of temperature checks and masking, and follow all COVID-19 mitigation procedures; person will report to leadership staff daily
Safety Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For the parents/guardians of campers and staff who fall into a medically sensitive group, express urgency to consult medical advice before attending camp • Distancing of 6 feet or greater, handwashing and sanitization posters throughout camp • Sending pre-camp and camp follow-up communication via email to urge participants to practice safety standards to limit spread • Communicating and implementing registration waivers for individuals who reschedule camp attendance due to illness • Opening camp with COVID educational introduction; normalizing NPIs and regular monitoring to create safe space for campers and staff to report symptoms
Transportation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All campers will receive a COVID-19 safety kit upon arrival at camp pickup; masks, sanitizer, gloves and other PPE will be included for use on bus • Windows on all busses will remain down throughout the entire ride to maximize ventilation • Bus company will utilize sanitization practices to manage spread of virus on surfaces and through air
