

## COVID-19 Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions at Camp Colley

NPI	Notes
Masking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Masking mandatory outside individual cabin group times</li> <li>Program facilitators will be masked during all activities and in all community spaces</li> <li>Administrative and leadership staff will be masked during all times when in community spaces</li> </ul>
Sanitization	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hand sanitizer will be readily available at every activity station, group tent, restrooms, throughout dining halls, and on-hand of every staff member at all times</li> <li>Staff will remind campers of regularly scheduled sanitization times; hourly at a minimum</li> </ul>
Handwashing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Handwashing stations will be increased for greater access</li> <li>Handwashing will occur between all activities, between meals, and before and after entering restrooms</li> <li>Tent groups will be assigned a designated handwashing station for their personal use</li> </ul>
Taking Temperatures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Temperatures will be captured upon camper drop off, then daily throughout camp</li> </ul>
Cohorting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Camper interaction will be reduced through cohort grouping; only certain tent groups will occupy the same physical space at camp at one time</li> <li>Groups will be limited in size to 40 campers at one time; 4 groups of 10 campers, all groups socially distanced by a minimum of 6 feet</li> <li>No all-camper activities will be facilitated</li> </ul>
Social Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Enforce social distancing policies for vendors and other guests on camp property; no contact with campers, limited distanced contact with staff</li> </ul>
Program Modifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Limit sharing of program equipment as much as possible</li> <li>100% sanitization for all equipment between use</li> </ul>
Mealtime Modifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Cohorting during mealtimes; no all-camper meals, 40 campers max at one time</li> <li>4 groups of 10 campers socially distanced during mealtimes</li> <li>All lunches will be prepared in way to be enjoyed with cabin group only outdoors</li> <li>Meals will be plated and served by designated kitchen staff</li> <li>All surfaces sanitized between each mealtime; complete dining hall sanitization 6 times daily</li> <li>Maximization of individually wrapped packaging (i.e. no shared condiment bottles)</li> </ul>
Increased Ventilation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Bus windows will remain down during entirety of trip to and from camp</li> <li>All building structures will maximize open windows and doors as greatly as possible</li> </ul>
Testing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Information about free Phoenix COVID-19 testing sites will be shared with all registered families to encourage testing 3-5 days before the start of their camp session</li> <li>Staff will be required to be tested for COVID-19 3-5 days before arriving at the start of the summer season and will need to show a negative test to begin staff training</li> <li>Staff will be randomly tested throughout the summer on a lottery basis to ensure we catch any community spread of COVID-19 that may have entered camp</li> <li>Camp Colley will work to acquire rapid testing kits that will be administered to any campers or staff that is placed in medical isolation</li> </ul>
Pre-Camp Quarantining	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Campers will be strongly encouraged to isolate at home for 3-5 days leading up to the start of their camp session to help prevent contracting COVID-19 after testing;</li> </ul>

	<p>communications to families with outlined information about this process will be shared in advance of their session</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Staff will be required to isolate at home for 3-5 days leading up to the start of the season, and after arriving at Camp Colley will group isolate for 7 days throughout the staff training week</li> </ul>
Isolation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Separate isolation tents will be utilized to immediately separate any campers and staff who demonstrate any symptoms of COVID-19; the person's health will be monitored by the camp nurse to measure any improvements and a rapid testing kit will be administered before reintroduction to the larger camp community</li> <li>• Isolation communications plan will be implemented to notify a camper's family of possible COVID-19 infection based on symptoms present</li> <li>• Campers in isolation will be given alternative activities throughout their time spent away from their group and will be cared for 2:1 by staff who will maintain distance and safety precautions to maintain their own health</li> <li>• For the safety of the remainder of camp, the group of which the participant experiencing symptoms will also quarantine away from the remainder of the camp population; a "shadow camp" will be facilitated so that the children can participate safely in all camp activities as planned</li> </ul>
Limiting Outsiders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Visitors will be strictly limited to necessary persons only and will be required to maintain all NPI protocols throughout their time at Camp Colley</li> <li>• All visitors must be approved by program director and/or executive director</li> </ul>
Health Surveillance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Train staff on picking up on early warning signs of sick individuals</li> <li>• Check in with staff and participants on regular schedule to monitor any emerging symptoms of sickness</li> <li>• A health surveillance work sheet will be included in pre-camp informational email; worksheet monitors daily health, diet, etc. and is shared by the Camp Nurses Association</li> </ul>
Identify Responsible Parties for Monitoring NPIs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As part of their weekly responsibilities, 1-2 float staff will be assigned to be the monitoring and upkeep of NPI supplies and implementation, including refilling soaps, sanitizers, use of temperature checks and masking, and follow all COVID-19 mitigation procedures; person will report to leadership staff daily</li> </ul>
Safety Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For the parents/guardians of campers and staff who fall into a medically sensitive group, express urgency to consult medical advice before attending camp</li> <li>• Distancing of 6 feet or greater, handwashing and sanitization posters throughout camp</li> <li>• Sending pre-camp and camp follow-up communication via email to urge participants to practice safety standards to limit spread</li> <li>• Communicating and implementing registration waivers for individuals who reschedule camp attendance due to illness</li> <li>• Opening camp with COVID educational introduction; normalizing NPIs and regular monitoring to create safe space for campers and staff to report symptoms</li> </ul>
Transportation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All campers will receive a COVID-19 safety kit upon arrival at camp pickup; masks, sanitizer, gloves and other PPE will be included for use on bus</li> <li>• Windows on all busses will remain down throughout the entire ride to maximize ventilation</li> <li>• Bus company will utilize sanitization practices to manage spread of virus on surfaces and through air</li> </ul>
