Evaluation of systems of care (SOC) in tribal communities presents some unique considerations. This web event will provide a context for evaluation in tribal communities by outlining considerations and contextual realities including historical trauma, concerns about sharing sensitive information, concerns about how information will be used, resources for collecting data, and whether/how evaluation will benefit tribal families, SOC leaders, and service providers. Presenters will:

- Discuss how these considerations have been encountered in the CMHI National Evaluation
- Describe effective and culturally responsive strategies/supports that have facilitated SOC evaluation in tribes
- Include two tribal grantee teams who will highlight their strategies for collecting systems/service data and child and family outcomes as well as using the results for continuous quality improvement

SOC leaders and evaluators from tribal communities are encouraged to participate, as well as leaders and evaluators from states and communities that currently are or have an interest in working with tribes on evaluation.
