
Median household income is \$4.9K above the national median household income of \$57.7K.

Takeaways

- As of 2019 the region's population increased by 8.9% since 2014, growing by 172,657. Population is expected to increase by 5.9% between 2019 and 2024, adding 124,057.
- From 2014 to 2019, jobs increased by 9.8% in Tarrant County, TX from 920,919 to 1,011,469. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 6.9% by 2.9%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate decreased from 66.1% to 65.4% between 2014 and 2019.
- Concerning educational attainment, 20.5% of Tarrant County, TX residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (1.7% above the national average), and 7.2% hold an Associate's Degree (0.9% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2019 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and General Medical and Surgical Hospitals.








Tarrant County, TX had a July 2019 unemployment rate of 3.48%, **decreasing from 5.03% 5 years before**.








Racial Diversity


Tarrant County, TX has 461,965 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 428,637.

Retirement risk is low in Tarrant County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 603,520 people 55 or older, while there are 474,051 here.


Racial diversity is high in Tarrant County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 826,038 racially diverse people, while there are 1,127,501 here.


Tarrant County, TX has 108,552 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 119,844.














Top Occupation LQ




Top Posted Occupations


