Targeted Search and Victim Removal (VEIS)

This all-day class is intended to be a primer on the application of VEIS, targeted search and victim removal from residential structure fires. The morning portion will consist of discussion and explanation of the determining factors and the decision-making processes leading to the use of targeted search. Also covered will be some basic ladder and access techniques, tool selection and victim positioning and removal from first and second floor locations. The afternoon session will provide opportunities for hand-on application of the discussed principles and techniques in a simulated fire environment. PPE requirements: Full structural firefighting PPE and SCBA. Class size is limited. Students must be comfortable operating in Structural PPE and SCBA prior to the class and be able to perform difficult physical tasks while "on air".

Aircraft Firefighting Rescue

This 4- hour class will provide instruction from both the classroom and some hands- on skills related to ARFF. Airport and aircraft familiarization will be covered with the Bowling Green Warren County Airport serving as the basis of the information. Numerous IFSAC skills will be addressed in the 4 hours. A plane prop will be available for aircraft response simulations. All instructors for this 4- hour class offered on both Saturday and Sunday of the Fire School will bring with them experience and certification that will make this a class valuable for anyone desiring a greater understanding of ARFF.

Basic-20 Firefighting Course

ATTENTION CHIEFS: If you have a new member in your department, this is the course for them! Experienced fire instructors will cover the basics of Admin, Safety, Fire Behavior, Extinguishers, Forcible Entry, Ventilation, Ropes, Fire Control, Appliances, Salvage & Overhaul, hose, ladders, SCBA, Drivers Training (POV) and PPE. The course will include "hands-on" drills and the opportunity for students to don protective equipment.

Note: This course is a 3-day course held Friday through Sunday

Class limited to 30 students.

Full PPE is required including SCBA and a spare Cylinder. Students must be 18 years of age.

Flashover Chamber- classroom lecture and Burn

FLASHOVER (Classroom lecture and Burn) Welcome to the Kentucky Fire Commission Flashover Recognition & Survival Course. This course was created and adopted to provide structural firefighters in Kentucky, a safe and secure system of Flashover training. This course meets the 8-hour requirement for all firefighters seeking the 400-hour certification level in Kentucky. The goal is to improve recognition and provide survival techniques to save firefighters from injury and death from rapid fire progression and related phenomena.

PREREQUISITES: Live Fire Course Competency Validation form (or similar verification). Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with 29 CFR 1910.134 (OSHA). Protective gear will be inspected prior to entry into the trailer. All gear must be within the 10-year from manufacture date. Required Equipment: In-date turnout gear and SCBA Live Fire Competency Validation Form

Fire Blast -Prop

This class will utilize the Kentucky Fire Commission's new Fire blast Burn Trailer to provide the students with a variety of fireground situations. Included in the capabilities of the trailer will be firefighting a below grade fire, standpipe operations, pitched roof ventilation, second story firefighting, room and contents fire, search and rescue operations in a smoke-filled environment and other situations as time allows. Students enrolling in this class should come prepared to learn and work as a firefighting team. This class will benefit both new and experienced responders. This class will concentrate on hands-on "learning by doing" skills. **The Firefighter must bring PPE, a full SCBA and spare cylinder. PPE will have to be with-in the 10-year life span and in good shape.**

This class is limited to 30 students.

Modern Vehicle Extrication

This class will begin with a short PowerPoint to address the dangers of extrication on electric vehicles. There will be an electric vehicle onsite to look over after the PowerPoint. The class will then move outside to practice extrication techniques on small to large vehicles and will have some technical scenarios to work through. This class will provide the students the opportunity to access, plan, and implement extrication strategies in a variety of passenger vehicles. **Full personal Protective equipment without SCBA is required. Prerequisite: Working knowledge of basic rescue tools.**

High Angle Ropes Exposure

This all-day class is an introduction to the basic principles and application of high angle rope rescue operations. The morning session will consist of classroom discussion and explanation of equipment, techniques, and safe practices. The afternoon session will consist of hand-on application and opportunities to both operate systems and perform “entry rescuer” tasks in a live high angle environment. **PPE requirements: Lace up boots, long pants, leather gloves, safety glasses, helmet (technical rescue or structural firefighting certified type helmet).** Class size is limited. Comfort with the “Family of 8 knots” prior to class is preferred for students.

Man-Vs-machine Traumatic Injury Extrication

Have you ever received a call for someone stuck in a HVAC vent, A wedding ring stuck on a finger, or a motorcycle accident Victim impaled on a signpost? The rescuer often finds difficulty in approaching these situations simply because of the unknown. Our instructors will provide “out of the box” ways of thinking that is usually not incorporated with normal fire service operations. This class will help students develop a framework of techniques and tools that will make this operation smooth and safe. At the end of this class the student will be confident in proper tool choice for these types of incidents and able to operate with confidence on scene. This class focuses on hands-on training using many different types of cutting tools to complete extrication scenarios. **Pre-Requisites: Safety Glasses, Helmet, turn out coat and work gloves.**

Note: This is a two-day class offered Sat & Sunday.

Firefighter survival & Rescue

The Kentucky Fire Commission mandates that ALL firefighters need to attend the Firefighter Survival & Rescue course to attain certification as a firefighter in KY. The Firefighter Survival course is the first segment of this training course and is intended to illustrate to the student the procedures to implement and follow to save oneself in the event of a catastrophic event on the fireground. The Firefighter Rescue is the second segment of this course and is intended to train the firefighter how to work to rescue someone else in the event of a bad situation on the fireground. Firefighter Survival will be offered on Saturday and Firefighter Rescue will be offered on Sunday. Junior firefighters are welcome in this class. **FULL PROTECTIVE CLOTHING & SCBA REQUIRED**

EMT Refresher

This is the mandatory section of the U.S. DOT EMT-Basic Refresher as required for recertification as a National Registry EMT-Basic. This 24-hour course will also qualify as CEs for state recertification as an EMT-Basic. This course will provide you the required hours needed to recertify for your current EMT license. This course will also include the 2-hour HIV/AIDS education requirement. Students should bring a CPR pocket mask, penlight, and stethoscope.

NFA Incident Safety Officer

The safety officer oversees all tasks performed by firefighters on the fire grounds. Safety Officers are responsible for immediately correcting safety problems and creating an awareness of simple precautions that can save lives and prevent injury. The goal of this course is to provide firefighters with skills to function effectively as the safety office at the fire department incident operations. The primary focus shall be on developing decision-making skills through the recognition of problems that affect personal safety. Target audience would be firefighters who may have the safety Officer responsibility at Emergency Operation situations.

ISO PPC Program-Hauled Water Evaluation

This program will discuss the basics of the ISO PPC program and Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS). A specific focus will be on utilizing a hauled water evaluation for credit of a protected classification. The program will discuss apparatus requirements, water haul evaluation process, dry hydrants/suction supply points, and needed documentation. The students will be prepared to assist their department in completing a hauled water survey to improve their ISO PPC classification.

NFA Course-Strategy and Tactics for Initial Company Operations (STICO)

This course is designed to develop the management skills needed by Company officers to accomplish assigned tactics at structure fires.

The course addresses professionalism, resilience, emotional intelligence, and situational awareness, as well as managing conflict, delegating, mentoring, coaching, empowering, and building collaboration and synergy for professional growth.

Fire Department / Emergency Management Planning and Response to weather-Related Emergencies

Emergency responders today are faced with increased challenges to their successful completion of mission. Weather affects every first responder, and severe weather can be a real threat to the safety and wellbeing of responders and citizens alike. As we have recently witnessed in both December and July, Kentucky and the entire regions experiences a wide variety of weather phenomena which ultimately leads to responses from the local fire department and other public safety agencies. This course will include information about some of the more common weather phenomena experienced in Kentucky, how to pre-plan for it, ways to anticipate its arrival, and discuss ways to improve fire department response in its aftermath.

Active Shooter Preparedness-Integrated Initial Response

“Integrated Initial Response to School Violence Incidents” This course has been developed by the WKU Disaster Science Operations Center in partnership with the Barren River Area Development District, Kentucky Fire Recue Training, Kentucky Emergency Management, Warren County Sheriff’s Department and Western Kentucky University. This class will include both classroom and demonstration/Hands on segments. Overall, this course will include: the characteristics of an active shooter/mass violence incident, incident command /unified command, initial response by law enforcement, Fire/EMS response, Rescue taskforce concepts, and pre-planning considerations. Students will discuss the elements of active shooter incidents, describe common behavior, conditions, and situations associated with these types of events.

Fire Investigations for First Responders

The purpose of this course is to provide first responders with the tools to understand the key role they play in fire scene examination and in preserving and protecting important evidence for any subsequent investigation. The content of this course will provide a clear definition of the role of the first responder in arson detection and provide essential knowledge to enable him or her to recognize the potential of intentionally set fires, preservation and protection of evidence, and proper reporting of information to appropriate officials. Law Enforcement welcome and encouraged to attend.

This is a comprehensive course with emphasis on techniques to determine the origin and cause of fires. Actual case scenarios will be incorporated to enhance this class. A wide variety of expertise is brought together through the cooperation of local, state, federal, fire, police, and private investigators to provide the student with excellent instruction and detail.

Note: Pre-Requisites include proof completion of an acceptable Arson 1 course. You must have a signed permission from your chief prior to attending fire investigation courses taught by the Kentucky Chapter of IAAI. Students will need Full Protective Turnout gear.


