Published in 1937, this book was not appreciated when it first came out and quickly went out of print. It wasn't until the 1970s, when writer Alice Walker rediscovered Hurston, that the book was reissued. *Their Eyes Were Watching God* is now considered an American Classic and is required reading in many high schools and universities.

The story is told through the eyes of Janie Mae Crawford, an African-American woman whose life has taken her through three marriages in her search to find love and also discover herself and her place in the world. As the book jacket says, it "pays quiet tribute to a black woman who, though constricted by the times, still demanded to be heard."
