Florida is the original tourist destination and the state became a playground for northerners since the 1830's. This interesting topic covers popular tourist roadside attractions before Disney World. Some examples include Six Gun Territory, Miami Serpenterium, Pirates World, Bongo Land, Dr. Vedder's Museum and many more from North to South Florida.

A Florida native Zach, has been with the Museum of Arts and Sciences for 25 years and is the Senior Curator of Education and History with a specialty in Florida history, art, and paleontology.

In 2011, Zach discovered the Daytona Mastodon in a drainage pond near the museum creating a gallery for the Giant Ground Sloth and Daytona Mastodon.
