Outpatient Quality & Patient Safety Updates

- Tier 1 safety huddles will be implemented in all of our outpatient clinics in May.
- Huddles provide a brief, timely opportunity to discuss safety or workflow concerns that can impact patient care.
- Look for more details soon from your clinic manager colleagues.

SAFESS+		Topics/Questions
Safety		Any patient safety concerns? Severe Safety Events or Good Catches Any workplace safety concerns? SAFE report updates What might go wrong today? What can we do to prevent/mitigate?
Announcements		What needs to be shared today? What information needs to be cascaded from other huddles? What updates about escalated items needs to be shared?
Flow		What is our census / volume of activity today? What barriers / bottlenecks to throughput do we anticipate? Any unusual procedures? ("heads up")
Equipment		Any equipment issues or unexpected downtime? Any equipment due for preventative maintenance?
Supplies		Do we have what we need? Any items out of stock? What might we need today?
Staffing		What takes us away from the patient's side? What help might we need today?
+ Plus Wellness		Do we anticipate any patient experience issues? Any possible service failures? Do we have any wellness concerns today?
