VIRTUAL VISITS FOR PATIENTS LOCATED OUTSIDE OF NORTH CAROLINA DURING THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY GUIDANCE FOR UNC HEALTH PHYSICIANS

It is the policy of UNC Health that physicians may only provide virtual visits¹ to patients located in states outside of North Carolina if: 1) the patient is an established patient of the physician (seen by the physician or a physician in the practice during the last two years), and 2) the patient is located in one of the following states below. Consult the table below for licensure requirements in those states.
