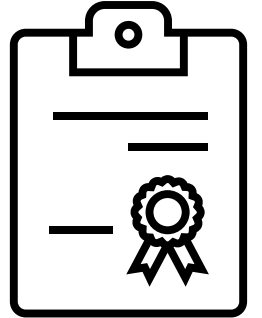
Quality and Safety

March 2023



- USNWR Survey-Submitted
 - Submitted last month; thanks to everyone for their efforts
 - Process still needs improvement
 - Please send specific feedback/suggestions to USNWR team (Lane Donnelly, Martha Perry, Heidi Troxler, Bays Seagroves, Mike Henry, Benny Joyner)
 - Met with ISD data team on March 3rd to develop report for volumes using USNWR-provided ICD-10 codes
 - Some ways to automate will require EPIC changes so will need to discuss:
 - Flu data capture
 - Home DME capture
- Hospital-wide FY23 LOSI reduction project is making great strides
 - Kudos to 6CH for meeting (and exceeding) their LOSI goal, and thank you to our hard-working nurses, respiratory therapists and hospitalists!

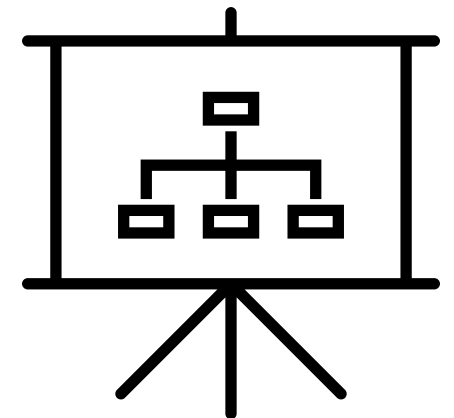
- Service line leaders/Content Experts
 - Responsibility to respond to SAFE report concerns in a timely fashion
 - SAFE reports are a way to understand trends/safety concerns
 - SAFE reports are **NOT** a replacement for conversations to occur in real-time
 - SAFE reports **ARE** a way to document concerns in real-time to ascertain if the issues that occur are one-offs or evidence of a systemic issue
 - The concern regarding “weaponization” of SAFE reports is understood.
However, please understand that the placing of a SAFE report is not the end of a process and also, follow-up on SAFE reports (in general) identify those SAFE reports that are weaponized versus those that identify systemic issues.



- CIC will have report out of quality registry databases
 - February: CF registry, PC4, PAC3, IAC
 - April: CNOC, STS, ELSO, IMPACT
 - June: Trauma & remaining surgery registries
 - August: NCCC registries & Peds sedation registries
 - October: SPS & CHA, Improve Care Now (GI) registry, IPSO Collaborative
- If you are (your division is) participating in a database and you don't see it noted above, please reach out.
- Goal: high-level overview identifying gaps/needs and connect data collection with patient care implementation

Quality Program Organization

- Working to better understand and organize quality efforts within children's
- Starting process to assess meeting cadence, resource utilization and communication across interprofessional silos
- As division chiefs/children's leaders, you may be engaged in this process to help us better understand how to work with you to improve quality



Clinical Updates



- NCCC Expansion Underway

- 61 beds soon to go to 64; phase 1 construction to start on 6 NPCC later this month

- Staffing

- RN new grads have started and another group will start this summer
 - Reminder: Support, teach, engage
- Physician engagement and interactions with RNs is important to retention

- Census and Capacity

- Huddles 2x a day
- No closures to Peds Trauma in the last month; trauma Accreditation report period underway
- Transfers
 - January: over 200 requests; 126 accepted
 - Peak requests: 432 in October 2022
 - 57% acceptance (1730 patients) over the last 13 months
- Delays in direct admissions

- The hospitalist team of the Wilmington division is expanding coverage of newborns
 - The team will assume coverage of almost all newborns as of May 1st and anticipates hospitalist and APP recruitment to cover increased clinical needs
- Wilmington also continues to recruit in several specialties.
- The NNP coverage at Novant Brunswick Hospital is expanding and has made a huge impact in the care of families in the facility.
- An award given to Drs. Wesley Jackson (Neonatology Chapel Hill) and Fernando Moya (Neonatology Wilmington) will begin work soon!

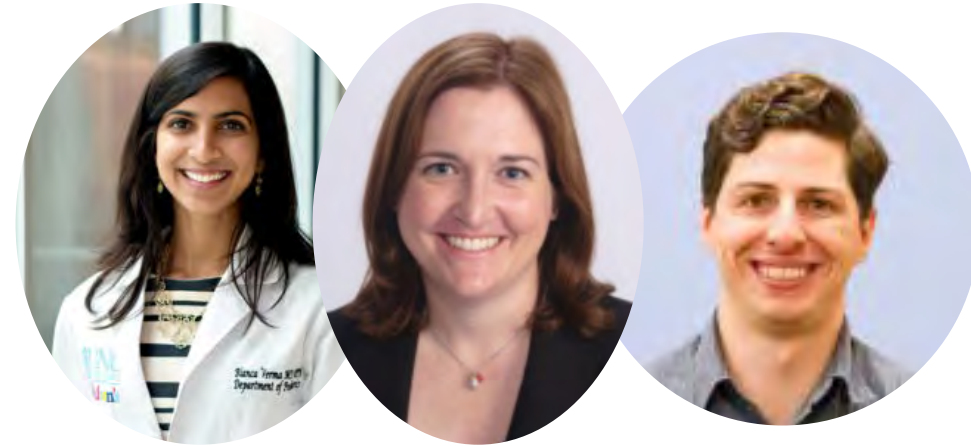

- **Equity of Resources and Incentives** - Availability of a clear incentives and compensation plan for PhD faculty that is tailored toward research faculty. Provide or advertise PhD-specific funding opportunities.
