
The team worked with Pediatrics leadership this spring to submit a Peds K12 under an extremely tight timeline, which if awarded, would provide competitive funding to train early career pediatric researchers to help grow our pipeline of future pediatric research leaders.

Their ability to work seamlessly with each other and the PIs has reduced burden on the PIs, increasing our shots on goal for funding opportunities, and paying off with recent awards (e.g., Dr. Jim Hagood's CZI award).



Suicide Screening Tool Live in EPIC

- Ask Suicide-Screening Questions (ASQ) is now live in EPIC
 - See emails from Dr. Ivester for details and link to the LMS module
 - Nurses complete initial ASQ; physician/APP gets a pop-up link to complete a Brief Safety Assessment for patients at non-acute positive risk
 - The BSA tool in EPIC takes providers through assessment and formulating a safety plan
 - If concerns about safety or active suicidality, please order sitter/suicide precaution and consult psychiatry
- We will send out more information on the BSA process
