Vaccine Certificate Update



Information gathered from Ontario Highland Tourism Organization

Effective September 22, 2021 Government of Ontario will require patrons to be fully vaccinated and provide proof of their vaccination status and proof of ID to enter certain businesses and organizations, with a focus on higher-risk indoor public settings. Requiring proof of vaccination to enter the specified businesses and organizations is based on the risk of the setting and aligns with the goals of overall provincial response to COVID-19

Steps for Businesses and Organizations: Proof of Vaccination

Match the **name** and the **date of birth** of the patron listed on the vaccination receipt against the name and date of birth on a piece of identification.

Verify the receipt is either:

an Ontario receipt (illustrated)

• a receipt signed by an Indigenous health provider

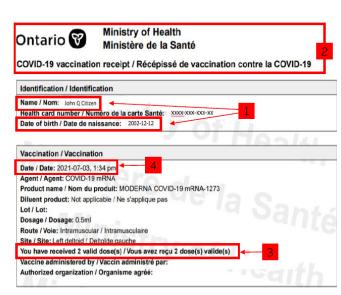
Verify that the receipt shows that the holder is

• a receipt from another jurisdiction

fully vaccinated (see slide 9).

Verify that the **date of administration** of the final

shot in the series is at least **14 days** prior to the date the patron is seeking access to the business or organization.



Providing Proof of Vaccination

Proof of vaccination can be shown on paper or on mobile device (e.g., PDF)

Accepted ID does not need to be

Accepted forms of ID:

- Birth certificate
- Citizenship card
- Driver's licence
- Government-issued ID card (Ontario issued or other), including health card
- Indian status card/Indigenous membership card
- Passport
- Permanent resident card
