GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Section 1: Intent

Request for Proposals-Glencoe Golf Club

It is the intent of the Village of Glencoe Golf Club ("Golf Club") to contract with a vendor ("Vendor") for its golf course restaurant operation including special event/outing catering, beverage cart service and vending machines for a period of two years.

This Request for Proposal (RFP) is intended to identify those caterers, restaurants, concession service operators or qualified individuals interested in operating the Glencoe Golf Club's food and beverage facility and beverage cart and to request from those interested parties a detailed plan as to how and under what conditions services would be provided to the Glencoe Golf Club.

The overall goal of the Glencoe Golf Club with respect to its food and beverage operation is to offer services that provide patrons at the Glencoe Golf Club, as well as members of the Village of Glencoe community, with an enjoyable and cost-effective dining and beverage experience. The successful food service provider will be able to operate these services in a manner consistent with the existing service level offered by the golf course and should create a plan that strives to exceed customer service and food/beverage quality expectations.

It is anticipated that the Glencoe Golf Club will enter into a two-year agreement with the chosen Vendor based on a flat fee as well as other financial considerations. The expected minimum annual flat fee is \$20,000. Rent payments will be made in 5 equal payments May through September. Exact terms will be determined during contract negotiations, including possible term extension or renewals.

Section 2: Evaluation/Acceptance of Proposals

The Golf Club intends to select a Vendor that furnishes satisfactory evidence that it has the requisite experience, ability, resources and staffing to enable it to perform the scope of work successfully. In making the determination as to whether to select a vendor, the Golf Club will consider the following factors (listed in no particular order):

1. Prior experience performing similar work.
2. Ability, capacity and skill to fulfill the services as specified.
3. References from prior or current clients.
4. Village's prior experience with Vendor, if applicable.
5. Financial soundness and stability of the Vendor
6. Assessment of the flat fee proposed and how advantageous the allocation of potential revenues will be for the Golf Club.
7. Quality of menu and food preparation expertise in meeting professional standards.

Proposals submitted are offers only and the decision to accept or reject is a function of quality, reliability, capability, reputation, and expertise of the Proposer.

The Golf Club may accept the proposal that is, in its judgment, the best and most favorable to the interests of the Village and to the public; reject the highest-priced proposal; accept any item of any proposal; reject any and all proposals; or waive irregularities and informalities in any proposal submitted or in the request for proposals

process. The waiver of any prior defect or informality shall not be considered a waiver of any future or similar defect or informality. Proposers should not rely on, or anticipate, any waivers in submitting their proposals.

Section 3: Award of Agreement

- A. **Reservation of Rights**. The Glencoe Golf Club reserves the right to accept the Offeror's Proposal that is, in their judgment, the best and most favorable to the interests of each of the Glencoe Golf Club and the public; to reject any and all Offeror's Proposals; to accept and incorporate corrections, clarifications or modifications following the opening of the Offeror's Proposals when to do so would not, in the Glencoe Golf Club's opinion, prejudice the process or create any improper advantage to any Offeror; and to waive irregularities and informalities in the process or in any Offeror's Proposal submitted; provided, however, that the waiver of any prior defect or informality shall not be considered a waiver of any future or similar defects or informalities, and Offerors should not rely upon, or anticipate, such waivers in submitting their Offeror's Proposals or until the Glencoe Golf Club affirmatively and in writing reject such Offeror's Proposal.

- B. **Time of Award**. It is expected that the award of the Agreement, if awarded, will be made within 21 days following the submittal deadline. Should administrative difficulties be encountered after the opening of the Offeror's Proposals, including the annulment of any award, that may delay an award or subsequent award beyond such 21 day period, the Glencoe Golf Club may accept any Offeror's Proposal for which the date for acceptance has been extended in order to avoid the need for re-advertisement. No Offeror shall be under any obligation to extend the date for acceptance of its Proposal. Failure of one or more of the Offerors to extend the date for acceptance of its Offeror's Proposal shall not prejudice the right of the Glencoe Golf Club to accept any Offeror's Proposal for which the date for acceptance has been extended.

Section 4: Insurance, Hold Harmless and Indemnification

In addition to other standard contractual terms the Golf Club needs, the Golf Club will require the selected vendor to comply with indemnification, hold harmless and insurance requirements as outlined below:

Vendor shall defend, indemnify and hold the Village, Golf Club, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers harmless from any and all claims, injuries, damages, losses or suits including attorney fees arising out of or resulting from the acts, errors or omissions of the Vendor in performance of this Agreement, except for injuries and damages caused by the sole negligence of the Village.

The Vendor shall procure and maintain, for the duration of this agreement, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Vendor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors. The cost of such insurance shall be paid by the Vendor. Insurance shall meet or exceed the following unless otherwise approved by the Village of Glencoe.

- A. **Minimum Levels of Insurance**
 - 1. **Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability:** \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage and \$2,000,000 in aggregate (which policy shall include any and all liability arising from the use of the Beverage Cart or Golf Carts)
 - 2. **Automobile Liability:** \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage.

3. Worker's Compensation coverage as required by the Industrial Insurance Laws of the State of Illinois.
4. Dram shop insurance in the statutory amount of \$1,000,000 (whichever is less)

B. Other Provisions

The policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

1. General or Commercial Liability and Automobile Liability Coverages
 - a. The Village, Golf Club its officials, employees and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds with respect to: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the vendor; products and completed operations of the vendor; premises owned, leased or used by the vendor; or automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the vendor. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Village, its officials, employees or volunteers.
 - b. The vendor's insurance shall be primary insurance with respect to the Village, its officials, employees and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Village, its employees or volunteers shall be excess of the vendor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
 - c. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the Village, its officials, employees or volunteers.
 - d. Coverage shall state that the Vendor's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
2. All Coverages
 - a. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party except after thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to the Village.
3. Acceptability of Insurers
 - a. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current Bests' rating of A- or better, or with an insurer acceptable to the Village.
4. Verification of Coverage
 - a. Vendor shall furnish the Village with certificates of insurance and copies of actual insured endorsements affecting coverage required by this clause. The certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf and shall name the Village, its officials, employees and agents as "additional insureds" except for coverages identified above. The certificates are to be received and approved by the Village before service commences. The Village reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies at any time.
5. Subcontractors
 - a. Vendor shall include all subcontractors as insured under its policies or shall require subcontractors to provide their own coverage. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.

Section 5: Other Terms

No Collusion

In submitting this proposal, the Proposer declares that the only person or party interested in the proposal as principals are those named herein, and that the proposal is made without collusion with any other person, firm or corporation.

Engagement

The Proposer further understands and agrees that if their proposal is accepted, the individual will enter into an engagement with the Village to provide the services with twenty one (21) days of receiving notice of the selection.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSAL PROCESS

The process for the procurement of the desired concession services will proceed in the following stages:

3) Evaluation of Proposals: The listed criteria will be used in the evaluation of the following: Written submissions of Vendor qualifications; interviews with Vendor and/or key staff, previous and current company clients; and the responses during oral interviews, if applicable. Each written response to this RFP must include sufficient narrative to adequately address each item listed below:

- **Financial Considerations**
 - a) The Glencoe Golf Club will be assessing each submission with respect to the flat fee proposed and how advantageous the allocation of potential revenues will be to the Glencoe Golf Club.
 - b) Financial soundness and stability of the Vendor (individual or company)
 - c) Financial statements must be the result of a compilation, review or audit by an independent certified public accountant.
- **Vendor Considerations**
 - a) Quality of menu and food preparation expertise in meeting professional as well as Glencoe Golf Club standards.
 - b) Ability to provide all requested services in a timely fashion.
 - c) Understanding of the nature and scope of services being requested by the Glencoe Golf Club.
 - d) Performance on previous similar license agreements or concessions, if available. The Vendor shall furnish a description of two to five similar agreements, complete with contact person, contact phone number, dates of project, duration of project.
 - e) Qualifications and experience of the Vendor and their staff.

- 4) **Oral Interview:** Qualified Vendors and key staff and representative prior clients may, at the Glencoe Golf Club's option, be asked to participate in an interview to fully discuss how their approach to this project satisfies the evaluation criteria set forth above.
- 5) **Selection of a Food and Beverage Concession vendor:** The Glencoe Golf Club will select the Vendor best qualified to provide the desired food and beverage services in a manner most advantageous to the Glencoe Golf Club from a financial as well as service perspective.

THE GLENCOE GOLF CLUB RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REJECT ANY OR ALL SUBMISSIONS AND TO WAIVE INFORMALITIES AND MINOR IRREGULARITIES IN SUBMISSIONS RECEIVED AND TO ACCEPT ANY SUBMISSIONS IF DEEMED IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE GLENCOE GOLF CLUB TO DO SO.

- 6) **Execution of Agreement:** Upon selection of the Vendor, a final Agreement will be negotiated and executed between the selected Vendor and the Glencoe Golf Club after award of contract.

7) **Right to Reject Proposals**

Submission of a proposal indicates acceptance by the firm of conditions contained in this request for proposals unless clearly and specifically noted in the proposal submitted. The Village of Glencoe Golf Club reserves the right without prejudice to reject any or all proposals.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE SERVICES AT GLENCOE GOLF CLUB

Background

The Village of Glencoe is a mature community with a population of approximately 8,800. It is located in the North Shore region of northern Cook County along Lake Michigan, approximately 24 miles north of downtown Chicago. The Village is bounded by the City of Highland Park to the north, the Village of Winnetka to the south, the Cook County Forest Preserve District and Village of Northbrook to the west, and Lake Michigan to the east. The Village is a non-home rule, special charter municipality which operates under the council-manager form of government. The Village is a full-service community, with a consolidated Public Safety Department (police, fire and EMS); Public Works Department that includes all public infrastructure management as well as building, zoning and planning functions; Finance; Golf operations; as well as the functions of the office of the Village Manager/Clerk.

The Glencoe Golf Club (GGC) is one of the top public golf facilities on the North Shore located just 20 minutes out of Chicago. The facility consists of an 18-hole golf course, a 20-station driving range, a teaching academy and a short game practice area. All equipment currently in place will remain, owned and maintained by the Glencoe Golf Club.

Section 1. Points to note:

- The 18-hole golf course had over 41,000 rounds in 2020; estimated rounds for 2021 are 34,000.
- 20-station driving range sell over 9,000 buckets annually.
- The Glencoe Golf Academy operates at the facility and offers junior camps, clinics and individual lessons.
- The opportunity exists to post all menu and special event prices on the Glencoe Golf Club website. A link to your business will also be hosted on the GGC website.
- The ability exists to participate in a limited number of email blasts sent to our database, of over 20,000 individuals, to promote the restaurant and specials.
- Ability to advertise on the golf carts GPS monitors.
- A full liquor license for the sale of alcoholic beverages may be obtained through the Village of Glencoe's permit process that allows for alcohol sales in the clubhouse, on the outside patio and on the beverage cart.
- Tuesday morning ladies league plays for 22 weeks with over 50 members.
- Permanent Tee Time groups play on the weekends for 19 weeks May through September from 5:30am to 9:30am averaging 200 total players.
- The daily seating includes tables and chairs for 50 indoors, 15 on the sun porch and an additional 48 on the outside deck. Maximum occupancy for the clubhouse and sun porch is 164.
- The restaurant will be open from April 1st through the first Saturday in November.
- The dining room is available for non-golf rentals during the offseason and off-hours. These events may be planned with the permission of the General Manager and a room rental fee.

Section 2: Hours of Operation

The minimum hours of operation are based on business volume and customer needs. Minimum hours will be required unless prior arrangements are made with the General Manager. The General Manager may grant exceptions to the hours of operation requirements as a result of weather conditions. The beverage cart will be required to operate during peak days in the shoulder season and daily June, July and August when weather permits. The minimum hours of operation will be outlined in the final contract.

Section 3: Menus and Signage

The Vendor shall develop a proposed daily menu and outing menu and list of particular Concession Services to be provided for review and approval by the Golf Club Manager on an annual basis. In addition, each Menu shall include the list of items to be sold and the prices at which such items will be sold, this menu pricing will remain the same for sales on the beverage cart although pricing may be adjusted to include tax. An initial Menu and pricing must be approved by the Golf Club Manager, gratuities may be charged for outings/special events, ***an additional charge for service is not allowed***. The Vendor shall retain the right to modify the Menu, subject to the review and approval of the Golf Club Manager.

The Glencoe Golf Club retains the right to approve all signage and sign location prior to installation. The Vendor must clearly display all food prices. Signage should be professionally done and in good taste. Handwritten notes for menu items or pricing will not be considered acceptable.

Section 4: Pre-Proposal Site Visitation

Each interested Vendor may schedule a site visit prior to the RFP submission. Vendors should contact General Manager, Stella Nanos at 847-835-3330 or stellan@glencoeclub.com to schedule a private visit. At the time of the visit, additional questions can be answered, and information provided.

Section 5: Miscellaneous Vendor Requirements:

- Vendor must fully comply with all applicable laws and ordinances, including those relating to health, sanitation, alcohol service, safety and employment.
- Vendors are responsible for training all cooks, beverage cart personnel and kitchen support staff in a manner that is consistent with the extraordinary customer service the golf course aims to provide to patrons of the club.
- Vendor is required to maintain enough stock (food and beverage) to serve the public need.
- Vendor is responsible for maintaining/cleaning all areas of the food and beverage service facility including dining room, sun porch, kitchen, food storage areas, and patio.
- Vendor must clearly display its company name and logo to distinguish itself from the Glencoe Golf Club.
- Vendor is responsible for its own staffing, and its employees must conform to all Glencoe Golf Club rules and regulations as well as federal, state and local laws including workers compensation.
- Vendor shall offer all food and beverage items to Glencoe Golf Club staff at a 20% discount.
- The Vendor shall employ sufficient (trained) personnel in order to perform its obligations under this Agreement and uphold the service standards set forth by the general manager (and described in the Standards of Service). (Staff) employed by the Vendor must (deliver) the (required) customer service skills and will be evaluated by the general manager for (adherence to said Standards). In the event that the Vendor's staff is not fulfilling the standards set forth in this agreement (and the Standard of Service), the Vendor will make the necessary staff changes after review with the General Manager.
- In order to maintain an environmentally friendly facility, consideration will be given to those operations using "green" products and recycling.

- The Vendor will also be responsible for operational expenses of the kitchen, grease trap cleaning, screen cleaning, hood cleaning.
- At the conclusion of the season, Vendor is required to thoroughly clean all areas of the kitchen including food prep areas, refrigeration/freezer units, kegerator, food storage areas and cabinets, and all equipment supplied by GGC for use during the season. Cleaning must be performed to the satisfaction of the Manager. Alternatively, Vendor may elect to pay a cleaning fee of \$350 for an outside cleaning service.
- The Vendor will be required to use the point of sale system provided by the Golf Club.

Section 6: Golf Course Equipment

All equipment that is on-site is available for use by the selected vendor. The Glencoe Golf Club will pay for any routine repairs needed on this equipment. The vendor will be responsible for repairs that are caused by product misuse or negligence of the vendor's employees. If additional equipment is required, the Glencoe Golf Club will review and discuss with the vendor. The vendor is allowed to install new or supplemental equipment and remove the same equipment at the conclusion of the agreement. Any equipment that is to be added must first be approved by the Glencoe Golf Club and any additional cost associated with the added equipment must be paid for by the vendor.

Existing equipment is listed in EXHIBIT A.

Section 7: Maintenance Requirements

The Glencoe Golf Club will be responsible for all exterior and structural, systems maintenance for the facility. The Vendor shall be responsible for cleaning and maintaining the kitchen, the dining room, the screened in porch and the deck. Included in this cleaning is vacuuming, washing down tables and chairs, maintaining outside furniture (bring in cushions and umbrellas on a nightly basis), general cleaning of dining room and screened in porch. Equipment and supplies for cleaning will be provided by the Vendor. The Vendor will also be responsible for maintaining and cleaning the kitchen food storage areas and the private kitchen bathroom to the satisfaction of Glencoe Golf Club management.

Section 8: Beverage Cart Policies:

- All employees responsible for sales on the beverage cart must be basset trained and be a minimum of 21 years old to operate the beverage cart.
- Beverage cart will be required to keep an adequate selection of drinks and snacks including, but not limited to, beer, wine, liquor as well as non-alcoholic selections.
- Vendor will be required to accept credit cards for all purchases made on the beverage cart. All expenses related to credit card fees will be the responsibility of the Vendor.
- Vendor is responsible for any damage to the beverage cart and the daily cleaning.

Section 9: Room Rental

In the event that the Glencoe Golf Club agrees to allow the Vendor to engage in other activities at the Golf Course or utilizing the Glencoe Golf Club's Concession Properties; the Vendor agrees to pay the Glencoe Golf Club an additional amount, that will be negotiated for room rental of non-golf related parties.

Section 10: Facility Supervision

The Glencoe Golf Club shall issue keys to the Vendor for the Food Service Facilities and Glencoe Golf Clubhouse entrance. The Vendor shall be solely responsible for entrusting these keys to their key personnel for locking and securing the Food Service Facilities and Glencoe Golf Clubhouse entrance.

Section 11: Utilities

The Glencoe Golf Club shall pay all utility expenses for electrical, gas and water as well as recycle and garbage disposal.

Section 12: Licenses and permits

Prior to commencing operations of the Concession Services, the Vendor shall obtain all necessary approvals, permits, and licenses, including without limitation: (i) a business license from the Village of Glencoe, (ii) liquor licenses from the Village and the State of Illinois, (iii) Special Activity Permit from Cook County obtained through the Village of Glencoe and (iv) required food service licenses. In connection with such approvals, permits, and licenses, the Vendor shall ensure that it or its personnel have the requisite training, certifications, licenses, skills, and capabilities to provide the Concession Services in accordance with required approvals, permits, and licenses, including without limitation, sanitation training, and BASSET training.
