

2021-2022 Title I Parent & Family Engagement Committee

Ms. Graur is in need of your assistance. Per guidance from Region 4 and to ensure HISD is in compliance with ESSA Section 1116, all Title I campuses are required to have an active Title I Parent and Family Engagement Committee in addition to the required Title I Parent Meetings. We need four (4) parents on the committee. If you are interested, please email [Ms. Graur](#) by Tuesday, October 26.

Here are the responsibilities of the Title I Parent and Family Engagement (PFE) Committee:

- Required to meet at least once during the fall semester and once during the spring semester
- Discuss, review, and revise the School/Parent Compact.
- Discuss, plan, and implement parent and family engagement activities/events.
- Discuss the use of Title I Funds for parent and family engagement activities/events.
- Discuss how the PFE Policy will be distributed on campus.
- Discuss the days and times of the Title I Parent Meetings.

HB4545

This past summer, House Bill (HB) 4545 was passed. The purpose of HB4545 is to provide accelerated instruction for any student who did not pass STAAR grades 3-8 or who did not take STAAR in Spring 2021. For those students who did not take STAAR, Pershing has already administered a beginning of the year TFA approved assessment. Students who scored at approaches or above on those tests are

exempted from the HB4545 requirements. Students who did not score at approaches or above or did not pass STAAR in the Spring, will be required to participate in accelerated instruction. Many of our students who need accelerated instruction have already been scheduled in math and reading intervention classes. For those who have not, they will participate in accelerated instruction during Homeroom, after-school tutorials, and Saturday tutorials.

On Friday we sent home letters to all students who are required to participate in accelerated instruction. Please take a moment to read the letter. HB4545 requires that students be in groups of no more than 3, unless a parent opts to allow us to increase the size of the groups. The parent notification letter sent out on Friday provides a place for you to opt-out. You can also opt-out by completing the form in HISD Connect.

For any student in 6th grade required to participate in accelerated instruction, Pershing must hold an Accelerated Learning Committee meeting. All meetings will be held via MS Teams. The date and time of your meeting appears on your letter. A calendar invite will be sent out during the course of this week. Please make every effort to attend the meeting on your scheduled date and at the scheduled time.

Socio-Economic Forms

Boston Massacre Crime Scene


This past week, our 8th Grade U.S. History classes participated in rotations focusing on the Boston Massacre. Here you see the Boston Massacre crime scene.

While visiting Mr. Amador's 7th Grade Math class, students were sharing their knowledge with the rest of the class by solving problems on the board.


Hoey's Help Desk
