SERVICE HOURS AND CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS

One of the most important things that colleges and the job market look for is a well-rounded applicant. As a college preparatory school, our mission is that our students leave here with a sense of service and a broader education in areas that may be unfamiliar to them.

This is why we have the service hours and the continuing education requirements. **In our student handbook, each high school student must turn in twenty (20) hours per year.** For example, if a student has attended all four years, the requirement would be 80 hours, but if they have only attended two years, it would be 40. Students must complete service hour forms (outside of room 702) and turn them in to Mrs. Wallace to receive credit. The required form ensures that they get the credit they have earned and protects them should there be a discrepancy in the number of hours. Every form is filed in a student folder. Please do not send in pictures of hours to

Mrs. Wallace. Each student must complete the form and turn it into the "Completed Service Hour/CEU folder outside Mrs. Wallace's room (702).


The continuing education unit program encourages our students to broaden their experiences through the arts, history, and other areas that may be outside of their typical interests. Students may attend plays, musicals, band concerts, speakers, and college fairs. They may participate in theatre performances and band performances, as well, to receive credit. They must bring in a playbill or any information given out at the event with their name on it and turn it into Mrs. Wallace. Lastly, the students have also been sent a list of online virtual tours they can watch and write a blog about (limited to one per semester). **The requirement numbers are as follows: last year, the high school students were asked to get two CEUs in the second semester, and this year, they will move to the full four a year for each year of high school.** For example, if you have a senior, they must complete the 2 CEUs from last year and four this year. A freshman would need 16 to meet the graduation requirement, a sophomore, two from last year, and an additional 12, and juniors would need two from last year and 8 in the next two years.


