Quarter dates: August 27, (closed 9.3), September 10, 17, 24; October 1.

Systemic SOLUTIONS; Miss Janna (Max 12) 3-5th Grade; TIME 3:00-4:00

Come Explore STEM with us as we dive deep into the heart of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math!! We will do everything from design cargo ships, roller coasters and space lander challenges!

FIZZY FOAMY SCIENCE; Miss Janna (Max 10) 1st-5th Grade; Time 3:00-4:00

These young scientist will be mixing safe powders to create solutions that foam and fizz! Along the way, you'll learn some cool science about fizz and foam and how to make it bigger and better. Each week, your child will get to act and think like a real scientist.

K.I.D.S Kids into Doing Science - "Back to School with a Bang" (Mrs. Livingston)

Fun, hands on, inquiry based STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) activities/science experiments. We will use math, science, and technology to discover more about the world around us (discount not available)

Silly Scientist - FUNology in STEM (Mrs. Champagne) (max 12) K5 & 1st; 3:00-4:00

While listening to a chosen Fairy Tale, we will use the main problem the character is facing to help us explore ways to solve the problem. We will use what we learn to build our models and put them to the test! We will share our final products and have group discussions! Students will have models to take home on selected weeks!

K5-5th grade; 3:00-4:00

Are you an American Girl at heart? If so, C'mon and join us! Bring your American Girl (or other favorite doll). This class will be filled with crafts, tea parties, and fashion all centered around your American Girl. We will learn about some of the historical American Girls and the lessons they teach. The crafts will include making different accessories for your doll. No need to have a doll, but bring one if you do!

Little Med School - Biomedical Department (Max 12)

K3-K5; 3:00-4:00

Come let us inspire tomorrow's healthcare professionals! We will teach the students about the importance of health through medicine and science in a fun and entertaining environment! The students will be actively engaged as they explore the world of medicine through interactive learning, role play, discovering how the body and organs work, how to use medical instruments, administer first aid and even suture. Who knows.....they may even get a Diploma for completing "Lil Med School"!

1st/2nd grade; 3:00-4:00

Students will develop their creativity and talents as they learn to express themselves, with beach style art, with different mediums such as paints, pastels, mosaics, and watercolors. We will create beach and summer style art. We will complete a minimum of 5 pieces of artwork!

Little Einstein Science Club - Ms. Janna (Max 10)

K3-K5; 3:00-4:00

These lil scientists will participate in lots of FUN activities during our math and science enrichment class! We will perform hands on science experiments, integrate science and math skills, make predictions, observe, and MORE.

CHESS CLUB (Mr. David from MPL) (class Max 10)

K5-5th Grade; 3:00-4:00

Chess Club will give children the opportunity to learn the game of Chess, improve their chess skills, and enjoy competition against their peers. Novice players will be taught the basic rules, the value of pieces, and how to checkmate. More experienced players will learn different opening and defense strategies, various tactics, and will be given the opportunity to challenge themselves by solving chess puzzles. While students will have the chance to measure their progress through wins and losses against their peers, our main focus will be on encouraging good sportsmanship and on having fun.
