MONDAY 3:00-4:00

Quarter Dates: Oct 22, 29, Nov 5, 12, Dec 3, 10

MYSTERY MONDAYS with Ms. Craig (3rd-5th Grade) (MAX 15) It's the most wonderfully spooky time of the year! We will focus on Alabama History. Topics of discussion: Haunted prehistoric Indian Sites and have "mounds" of fun, colonial forts and all of the ghastly "war"ries that continue to spook those who visit them. We will ponder the civil war, and why the ghosts that remain behind still aren't 'civil' to this very day, and MORE (Cost \$120) - (\$100 for SL regular attendees)

FIZZY FOAMY SCIENCE and LEGO Club with Ms. Janna (K3-K5) (MAX 10) These little scientist will be mixing safe powders to create solutions that foam and fizz. They will learn how to make it bigger and better! Each week, students will get to act and think like real scientists! For LEGOs, we will play to open up the world of early math and science. Students will learn the basic scientific principles as we ignite natural curiosity and foster a love of discovery and investigation. We will use our imagination to solve problems and build new creations each week! (Cost: \$120) (\$100 for SL regular attendees)

Oh La La Beginner's French with Mrs. Gleason (2nd-5th Grade) (Max 10)- A beginners introduction to the country of France and other French Speaking Countries. Students will learn beginner's phrases for conversational French in addition to numbers, letters, etc. We will also incorporate French culture through music and food! (Cost \$120) (\$100 for SL regular attendees)

MAGICAL WORLD OF HARRY POTTER with Ms. Janna (2nd-5th) (max 12) - We will be using our wizard skills to perform STEAM challenges, play Harry Potter inspired games, cast spells, make potions and sweet delights! (cost \$120) (\$100 for SL regular attendees).

STEM WITH LEGOS with Mrs. Champagne (K5-1st) (Max 12) - Large structure building including towers, house, tree, animal, robot (cost \$125.00)

JUNIOR MED SCHOOL with Biomedical Department (1st-3rd Grade) (Max 10) - Future doctors? I think so! Let us inspire tomorrow's healthcare professionals! We will teach students about the importance of health through medicine and science in a fun and entertaining environment. We will explore medicine through interactive learning, role play, discovering how the body and organs work, how to use medical instruments, administer first aid and even suture (Cost: \$120) (\$100 for SL regular attendees)

WEDNESDAY CONTINUED...

MATH FACTS CAMP with Mrs. Boyle (1st-3rd grade) (max 10) Come have fun learning your math addition, subtraction and multiplication facts. Students will be divided into skill level groups and be engaged through games, flash cards, songs, and drills to enhance their math facts memorization while working with their peers. Cost is \$120 for your first child and \$100 for their sibling.

PRIME TIME SLIME & LEGOS WITH MS. JANNA (K3-K5) (Max 10) We will make predictions about our dough, make our recipes, and draw a conclusion based on the outcome. We will be making/playing with different types of play dough, flubber, slime, and more. We will bring home samples of our creations and recipes to continue the fun at home. We will also have STEM activities with Legos for the second half of each class! STEM LEGO activities open up the world of early math, science, and language skills. LEGOS ignite a natural curiosity and foster a love of discovery and investigation. (Cost: \$120) (\$100 for SL+ regular attendees)

GAMING UNPLUGGED with Mrs. Tillman (Grades 2-5) (Max 10)- Join us to learn how to play classic board games with your friends! This is a time to turn the electronics off and enjoy connecting in real life. Games will include Twister, Battleship, Uno, Connect Four, Candyland, Sorry, and others! (Cost \$120) (\$100 for SL+ regular attendees)

FUTURE LIBRARIAN CLUB with Mrs. Tillman - (3rd - 5th Grade) (MAX12)- We will learn all things library: the Dewey Decimal System, how to catalogue books, how to create a SMART lesson and present it. (Cost \$120) (\$100 for SL+ regular attendees)

CHESS CLUB with Mr. David- (K5-5th Grade) (Max 10) - Chess club will give students the opportunity to learn the game of Chess, improve their chess skills, and enjoy competition against their peers. Novice players will be taught the basic rules, the value of pieces, and how to checkmate. More experienced players will learn different opening and defense strategies, various tactics, and will be given the opportunity to challenge themselves by solving chess puzzles. While students will have the chance to measure their progress through wins and losses against their peers, our main focus will be on encouraging good sportsmanship and having fun! TRANSFORMERS: TRASH TO TREASURE with Mrs. Thompson (3rd-5th) (Max 15) Students will be able to collect "potentially interesting" recyclable materials from home/school during the week (store in bin outside science lab) and use them to create an original form of "TREASURE" (STEAM - science, technology, engineering, ART, math) to share with and inspire school, family, friends. Each class objective will range from robots, musical instruments, visual arts, environmental contributions... Student ideas welcome. Final product: Display treasures in library with student written description of process. Cost \$125.00
