The Garces Victory Bellmade its debut in 1952, mounted on a wooden stand on the sidelines at home football games. In the early 1960s, Eagleson Bodyworks donated its trailer, and for several decades, it rang at games all over the valley, accompanied by the singing of our Alma Mater. Traditionally, the bell is rung once for each point scored. Its busiest night ever at Sam Tobias Field came after the 1999 Paraclete game when it was rung 62 times!

Today, each of you will have the opportunity to ring the victory bell, symbolizing your initiation into the Garces Memorial community, marking the beginning of your journey as part of our school's legacy. It instills a sense of pride and belonging while welcoming you into our tradition of celebrating achievements, both big and small.
