

THE SOUTH CAROLINA INN AT MONTREAT



Back in the early days of Montreat, Dr. R.C. Anderson offered free lots to any Synod which would build a house where its ministers could stay rent-free while attending Montreat conferences. Mr. McIver Williamson, a planter of Darlington County, made it possible for our Synod to qualify by erecting a sixteen room house at Montreat in 1912. In honor of his boyhood pastor, Mr. Williamson called the home The William Brearley-South Carolina Home for Ministers.

- *Ministers of the Presbyterian Church in the United States enrolled in supporting Presbyteries within the State of South Carolina are entitled to one week (or portion thereof) or one conference period free at the William Brearley Home per year. [1973 board minutes]*

2019 update:

Ministers who are a member of one of the five presbyteries of the Presbyterian Church (USA) in South Carolina may stay in the William Brearley Home for up to one week or seven consecutive days each year at no charge.

If the minister wishes to stay in one of the Kirk Apartments, the fee will be the difference between accommodations in the William Brearley Home and accommodations in the Kirk Apartments.
